From the Pastor's Study

Were they ashamed because of the abomination they had done? They certainly were not ashamed, and they did not know how to blush (Jer. 6:15; 8:12).

Jeremiah was saddened and concerned in the above verse (found twice in his book) that his generation knew no shame and could not blush. He knew God's blessing had been withheld because they refused to be ashamed for their sins (Jer. 3:3).

Vance Havner writes: "People used to blush when they were ashamed. Now they are ashamed if they blush. Modesty has disappeared and a brazen generation with no fear of God before its eyes mocks at sin. There is no revival, because even God's people will not humble themselves in sorrow for sin. Nothing is more needed than a sense of shame." These words were written in the early 1950s! But they describe our world today with astounding accuracy!

One characteristic of sin is that it hardens us to its dangers. As a people, we compromise with it under the banner of tolerance. When sin is literally paraded before our eyes, we join in the acceptance and accommodation. And, sadly, many Christians see nothing wrong with that picture. We say we are simply enjoying life as we embrace sin. After all, shouldn't we be loving and accepting. But, all the while, Jesus weeps just as He wept over Jerusalem (see Luke 19:41).

It is good to be reminded that Jesus died for our sins. So how can we be



comfortable with that for which Jesus died? A very important part of repentance is that we seek to daily forsake sin, to flee from it, and to walk with the Lord.

The apostle Paul wrote: "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him" (II Cor. 5:21). May this truth challenge and encourage us, as followers of Christ, to live for His glory in a sin-infested world. Yes, in the world but not of it!
