From the Pastor's Study

Looking at him, Jesus felt a love for him and said to him, 'One thing you lack...' (Mark 10:21).

This young man Jesus encountered had, as someone has said, "Manners, morals, and money." He was a fine individual and he had an excellent question: "...what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" (v. 17)

Although he was religious, he lacked a relationship with God. He did not consider being a disciple of Jesus, a follower of the Lord. Instead. he depended upon himself and his righteousness to get him into heaven. As such, he was like many people today. They'll join a church but will not consider Jesus' call to discipleship. But the Lord seeks worshipers, followers, not simply joiners.

Moderation can be good. Philippians 4:5 says, "Let your moderation be known to all men." There Paul means "Live with a gentle spirit and be considerate of others. Don't always demand your own way." All of us should have that kind of moderation.

But there is a kind of moderate Christian that's not so good. Wilbur Rees writes:

I would like to buy \$3 worth of God please. Not enough to explode my soul or disturb my sleep, but just



enough to equal a cup of warm milk or a snooze in the sunshine.
