




Exile Is Coming!




## Monday

2 Kings 17:6a & 7, "The king of Assyria captured Samaria, and he carried the Israelites away to Assyria... this occurred because the people of Israel had sinned against the Lord their God."

They worshiped fake gods in terrible ways and didn't obey any of the commands that God had given them. Because of this, God sent the Assyrians to capture Israel and take them captive.




## Tuesday

2 Kings 17:13, "Again and again the Lord had sent his prophets and seers to warn both Israel and Judah: 'Turn from all your evil ways. Obey my commands and decrees.'"

God deeply loved Israel. He loved them so much that he sent prophet after prophet to warn them about turning away from God. He sent Hosea, Jonah, Isaiah, and many others to warn Israel that there would be severe consequences if they didn't turn back to God.

God loves us so much that he allows us time to come to him. Jesus taught that God is patient, wanting everyone to have time and opportunity to turn to him. Because of Jesus, we do not face dire consequences for every little sin. However, we need to deal with sin as it comes up. Sin in our lives is like a seed in the soil. ## Wednesday

2 Kings 17:14, "But the Israelites would not listen!"

Even though God sent prophets to Israel, they did not listen. Even though there were terrible consequences, they would not listen. Even though they were walking away from God, they would not listen. They did not listen because their hearts were hardened. They had disobeyed God so much and for so long that they could no longer surrender their hearts to Him. This led to Assyria taking them over, even though it hurt God to punish them like this.

It is a beautiful thing that we have a God who is perfect and holy. We can trust His word, direction, and instruction. When he tells us to do something, it is so that He can give us the very best. He wanted Israel to experience His love and goodness. But, they hardened their heart or decided that God wasn't good enough for them, and then God couldn't bless them. God gave us Jesus! This means our sins are forgiven; however, to grow close to Him and experience Him in a better way, we have to surrender our hearts to Him. Even today, we can dedicate our lives to Him, choosing to listen to His word by obeying our parents, being honest, and putting others before ourselves.

## Thursday

2 Kings 17:18, "So the Lord was very angry with Israel and removed them from His presence. Only the tribe of Judah was left."

This was the saddest moment for everyone that lived in Israel. God removing Israel from the promised land. This was the ultimate punishment that he told them could ever occur. He even warned Moses what would happen if the people ever entirely walked away from God. In this way, we see that God is honest and faithful. He gave more opportunities than Israel could count, and they still refused him. But, he had a wonderful plan for Israel. There was always a promise that they would be restored! Remember, God told Hosea that Israel would be returned to Him one day after they were exiled.
