"WHO'S IN & WHO'S OUT?" - GALATIANS 2:1-10

Why is circumcision such a huge deal to these early Jewish Christians?

Why do the other apostles and Paul make a point to highlight the necessity of caring for the poor? Why does that matter so deeply when it comes to proclaiming the gospel?
