Part Five: Discernment and Determination

Nehemiah 6:1-16

Main Point: Any great work of restoration can encounter great opposition. The question is.. "what do we need to know to persevere?"

- When we are committed to God's work of restoration we become a threat to the enemy, because his goal is to stop the work of God in your life and in the lives of others.
- But if you commit yourself to God, there are several reminders from Nehemiah 6 to help us persevere when it gets even more difficult.

Persevering in the Work of Restoration.

- A. You can trust God for discernment.
 - ...In what is happening and how to respond
- B. You can say no to the enemy's schemes.
 - 1. Distraction and compromises
 - 2. Getting tangled up in disinformation
 - 3. Deception and intimidation
- C. You can be determined to persevere where it most counts.
 - 1. Where are we to be determined?
 - a) Our job is to identify that great work and protect our involvement in that great work from different kinds of opposition.
 - a) You are engaged in a great work of some sort. Identify it/them. Commit to it. Protect it. Be determined with it. And yes, sometimes you need to fight for it
 - 2. Some clues: where the brokenness is obvious, the stakes are high, mandate is clear, and grace is given.
 - 3. The example of Nehemiah reminds us of Jesus.
 - a) Luke 9:51 (NIV)

As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem.

b) Because of Jesus resolute focus and determination to head to Jerusalem, we can also have a holy determination in the great work He has us doing.
