DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Have someone in the group read Luke's account of the resurrection in **Luke 24:1-12**. Why do you think the disciples had such a difficult time believing the women's report in verse 11?
2. Have you ever struggled to believe the story of the resurrection? Why or why not?
3. Have someone read **1 Corinthians 15:3-8**. Why do you think Paul included the names of people who had witnessed Jesus after the resurrection? Why did he include the detail that more than 500 people saw Him at one time?
4. In **Acts 2:14-36**, Peter stands up and preaches the first post-resurrection sermon to a group of people who had been making fun of the disciples. Read **Acts 2:24** and **Acts 2:32**. Why do you think the resurrection of Jesus was so central to the message of the early church?
5. Do you think the church today places as much emphasis on the resurrection of Jesus as the early church did? Why do you think that is?
6. Have someone in the group read **Romans 8:11**. Unpack this passage together as a group. What stands out to you about this verse? What does it tell us about the importance of the resurrection in the lives of believers today? What does it say about our future?
7. Finally, how does the resurrection of Jesus give you hope?
