Quite often I used to joke, "Ministry would be great, if it weren't for people."

I was wrong.

This whole thing of sending out digital devotions and doing wired worship and communicating virtual values stinks. Give me people, warts and all.

Two days ago we had Easter online. Last night we did a Zoom church board meeting. Today (a Tuesday) is usually the day we pack the Selma staff into my office for a time of Bible study, prayer, calendar planning, and ministry dreaming. - "Forgive... one another" (Colossians 3:13)
- "Admonish one another (Colossians 3:16)
- "Encourage each other" (I Thessalonians 4:18)
- "Build each other up" (I Thessalonians 5:11)
- "Spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24)
- "Confess your sins to each other" (James 5:16)
- "Pray for each other" (James 5:16)
- "Live in harmony with one another" (I Peter 3:8)
- "Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling." (I Peter 4:9)
