6. One of the distinctions of the early Church was the breaking of bread and communion. Meaning, while they ate together, they also took communion to demonstrate their fellowship in Christ as well. Why do we tend to compartmentalize our spiritual life from our day-to-day life?
7. Another hallmark of the early Church was giving to others as they had need. Is your mentality tend more towards giving or receiving? How can we, as disciples, shift our mentality more towards a generous mindset?
