

Better Together - Acts 20:1-16

- 1. In Acts 20:4-5, Luke mentions eight men that were part of his missions team of people spreading the Gospel wherever they went. Often we think the only way we can spread the Gospel is by being on a mission trip or going on an outreach venture with a church. How do we change our perspective to see that everyone we encounter daily is our mission field?
- 2. As we read in this section of scripture, there was a constant stream of people around Paul as they were in community and ministry together. Why is it essential for us to have deep relationships with people?
- 3. Proverbs 18:1 says, "Whoever isolates himself seeks his own desire; he breaks out against all sound judgment." How can the enemy lure us into isolation?
- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 12:14-26. How does each of us play a role in the larger body of Christ? What is your part?
- 5. A significant facet of Biblical relationships is loving one another. Read 1 Corinthians 13. What should love look like in our ongoing relationships?
- 6. Discuss this scripture. Galatians 5:13 For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love.
- 7. The most significant relationship we can cultivate is with God. He invites us to have a relationship with him through worship. What are some different ways in which we can worship Him?
