Ten Commandments Egg Hunt

Materials

Commandment picture cards (following pages)
Timer
Plastic Easter eggs
Optional: small wrapped candies
Optional: poster putty

Instructions

Print and cut out one or more sets of commandment picture cards so each student has at least one card. Fold and put one card inside each plastic Easter egg (optional: add a candy to each egg). Hide all the eggs around the room.


Set the timer for a few minutes. Let the students search for the eggs and bring them back. Have students open their eggs. Call each student to the front in order of the commandments. Have students match their card with the same picture on the Flip Chart page then explain the commandment that is on their card.

For a larger class, prepare more than one set of eggs (sorted by colors for different teams). Students can work in teams to collect and put all the commandments in order. Review the commandments together.

Suggested Discussion

- **?** How many of you remember what all of the Ten Commandments mean? *Show of hands.*God gave the Ten Commandments so we would know how to honor him and treat others.
- ? Can anyone keep all these commands throughout his whole life? No.
- **?** Who is the only one who could keep all of God's commands perfectly? *Jesus*.

Right! No one can keep the Ten Commandments on his own. So the Ten Commandments remind us that we are all sinners and need Jesus to save us from the punishment of our sin.






