


God Gives the Ten Commandments Exodus 20:1-3, 20:7-8, 20:12-13, 20:15




Ten Commandments

What You Heard In the Word

- God gave the Ten Commandments to teach the Israelites (and us) how they should treat him and each other.
- Because none of us can keep the Ten
 Commandments perfectly, these commands also
 show us our sin and need for a Savior—Jesus.

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

- 1. Who should we honor with our words and put first in our lives? (Think about the first and third commandments.) *God*.
- 2. Who else should we honor by obeying them? (It's the fifth commandment.) *Honor our parents*.
- 3. The ninth commandment says we should not lie. What should we do instead? *Tell the truth*.
