

Grape Craft

Materials

- ☐ Grape Picture (next page)
- ☐ Purple and green yarn cut into 20-inch strands
- ☐ Purple, green, or iridescent glitter
- ☐ Liquid glue
- ☐ Scissors
- ☐ Construction paper
- ☐ Crayons or markers

Instructions

Print one Grape Picture on card stock for each student. Have students glue their picture onto one piece of construction paper for a framed effect around the edges.

Have students color most of the grapes, leaving 3–5 uncolored. Squeeze a thin layer of glue inside one uncolored grape outline at a time. Place the end of the yarn at the edge of the outline and follow the shape round and round, gently pushing the yarn into place with a finger or pencil tip. Continue to the center then cut off excess yarn. Leaves can also be done this way by using the tip of a pencil to help push the yarn into the corners as you go.

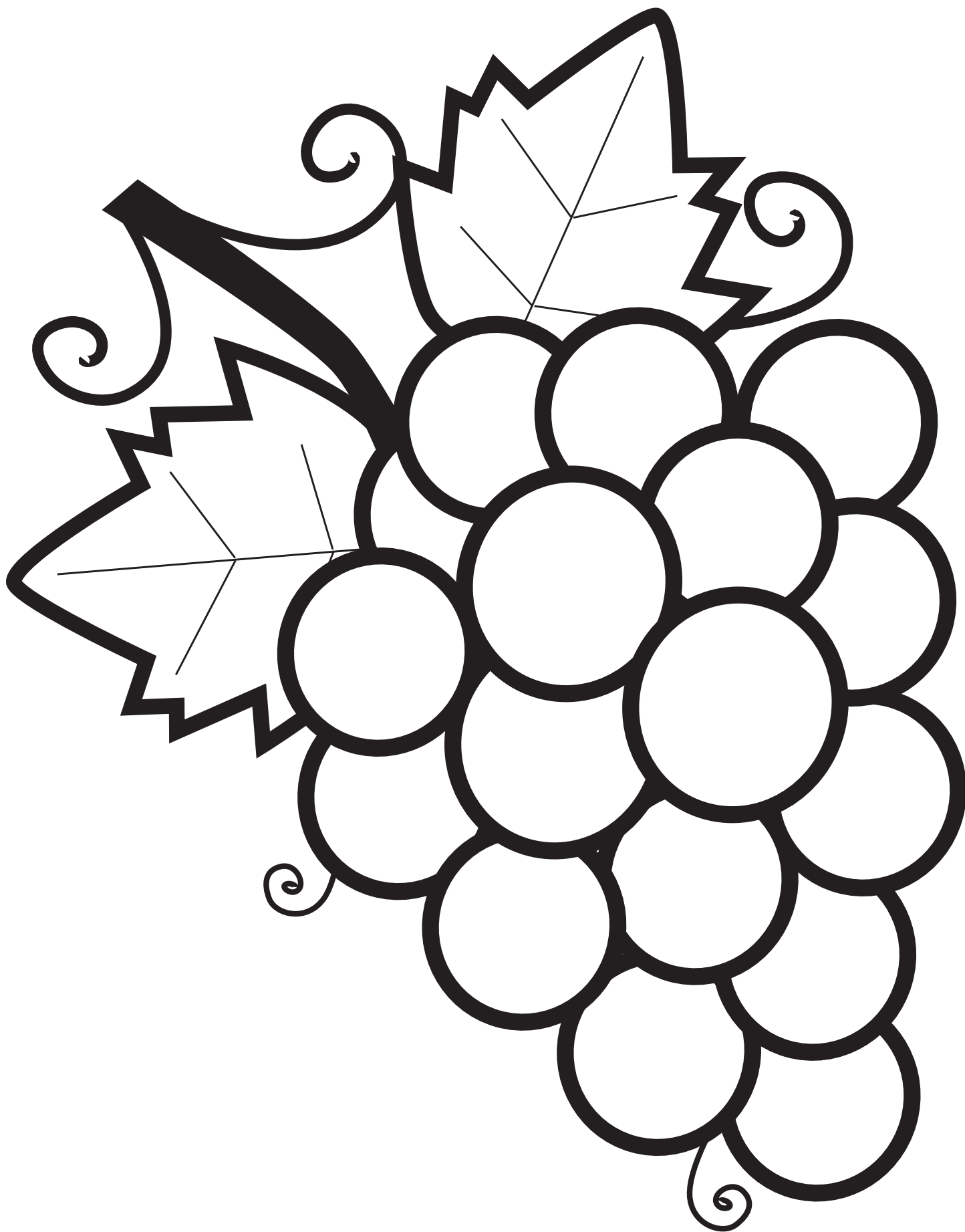
Option 1: choose a few grapes and/or leaves and squeeze glue over the yarn. Sprinkle with glitter. Allow to dry.

Option 2: color all or some of the grapes and leaves then use the yarn to outline them instead of filling the shapes with yarn.

Suggested Discussion
