## **Foundation of Contemporary Arts Artist Relief Fund**

Open to U.S.-based artists who've fallen on hard times because of the coronavirus outbreak. If you've had a performance or show canceled because of COVID-19, apply.

## **Sweet Relief Musicians Fund**

For musicians or music industry workers who lost 50% of your income, you're eligible to apply to this fund.

## **Musicians Foundation Fund**

For United States-based musicians who've been active for the past five years are eligible to apply for a microgrant. Keep in mind, this fund also asks for paperwork proving that most of your income has come from your work as a musician. We're also not sure how they define a "professional musician" but there is an email on the page where you can inquire for more information.
