IDENTIFYING NEIGHBORS

READ Luke 10:25-37

Read vs. 29

- What did the religious leader ask Jesus?
- In the parable, who was the neighbor? Why?
- Did Jesus define a neighbor by who lives next door?
- Did the Samaritan know this man who was beaten?
- Could it be that a neighbor is not defined by a house or location, but rather "all" people we have contact with in a day?

Read vs. 37

What did Jesus say "to do likewise"?

READ Philippians 2:3-4

³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

How could this apply to being a neighbor?

BUILD RELATIONSHIPS WITH NEIGHBORS

READ Luke 10:38-42

- ⇒ RELATIONSHIPS TAKE TIME!
- READ vss. 38-39



- Who was Jesus spending time with?
- Can you have a friendship or relationship without time invested?
- Have you ever spent more time with someone else's family more than your own? Is this healthy? Why or Why not?
- Can you spend too much time with the wrong crowd?
 Could this hurt you?
- Could time spent with someone of the opposite set when you are married cause problems? How & what kind?

NOTE: Time spent with people is important to develop a relationship, but we must be careful with whom we spend time and how much time we spend with them!

⇒ RELATIONSHIPS DESERVE PRIORITY!

- READ vss. 40-42
- What was Martha's priority?
- What was Mary's priority?
- Who did Jesus commend?
- Can the routine of life overtake relationships?
