ICE BREAKERS:

READ & EXAMINE:

James 4:7-10.

(The first time through, read it normally. Read it again a second time, but this time substitute the word "trainer" wherever you see the word "God" or "Lord").

 According to James, how do we draw near to God our trainer? • Name the ways listed in vs.7-10.

Read vs. 7 again.

- What does it mean to submit?
- Name some biblical characters who submitted to God.

Read 2 Chronicles 30:1-9.

<u>Note:</u> Hezekiah was a great king dedicated to God and the spiritual progress of his people. He even sent letters out urging people to submit to God.

Read 2 Chronicles 30:8 again.

- · What keeps us from submission?
- Share a time when you were stiff-necked/stubborn with God. Why do we get stubborn?
- Would someone be so brave as to share something with the group that God is dealing with you to submit to him?
- When was the last time you prayed David's prayer?

Read Psalm 139:23-24.

Isn't this about submission..."search my heart"?

Let's close, allowing God to search our hearts and reveal anything that does not look like Jesus. Then submit it!
