# COMPASSION - TO KNOW GOD

## What does it mean to know God?

*“Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. Many will say to me on that day, ‘Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and in your name drive out demons and perform many miracles?’ Then I will tell them plainly, ‘I never knew you.’”*

**MATTHEW 7:21-23**

The word Jesus used for “know” in that passage is an intimate term. It’s the Greek word, ginosko, which goes beyond intellectual knowledge or mental awareness to imply **personal, first hand experience**.

He knows **ALL** but loves **ALL** of you.

## What is Salvation and Who is Jesus?

Jesus is the **son** of **God**.

Jesus was **without** sin, so he could be the **perfect** sacrifice for the Forgiveness of our sins.

This gift of salvation requires a **response**.

*“If you declare with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved”*

ROMANS 10:9–10

## Should I feel anything?

When you decide to accept Jesus and pray that prayer, you may feel something... you may feel a sense of spiritual anticipation, you may feel goose-bumps... you may not feel anything. Ultimately if you do feel something enjoy it, but faith in Jesus is not about our feelings, it is about faith in who He is.

## Now What?

One of the next steps that you're going to want to do is to go public with your faith and declare to everyone “I'm a follower of Jesus” through baptism.

## Why should I be baptized?

Jesus **commanded** us

*16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. 17 And a voice from heaven said, “This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.”*

- When you go under the water it symbolizes that your old life is gone.

## How do we do baptisms at C3?

If you choose to be baptized, we are going to invite you on the day of your baptism to attend a pre-baptismal orientation to go over all the details of your baptism. Afterwards, during our service you will be baptized by a Pastor or someone who has spiritually poured into your life. They will ask you about your commitment to follow Jesus and then they're going to put you underwater. If you've been bad we'll leave you underwater for a little longer... just joking. Then they will bring you out of the water as the entire church celebrates your decision to follow Jesus. On this day we encourage you to invite your family and friends to be present and celebrate with you.

**Adoration** - is an act of praise and worship. Adoring the Lord means offering him the affections of your heart and paying honor to him for his mighty power, wisdom, strength, goodness, mercy, and love.

**Confession** - in the act of confession you are asking God to remove your old, sinful ways of living. God is faithful and just to forgive sins. Through confession we are made new and more like Jesus.

**Thanksgiving** - Thank God for what he has already done in your life and reflect on the many blessings in your life. Thank him for his faithfulness in keeping promises in your life, those of your family and friends, and the circumstances in your life.

**Supplication** - Ask the Lord to give you the desires of your heart. Align your heart with His will through reading and praying Scripture. Remind God of his promises to you.

# COMMUNITY TO GROW TOGETHER

*Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up.*

ECCLESIASTES 4:9-10

C3 Groups have two main goals:

1. **Connect** relationally
2. **Grow** spiritually

In other words, we say in groups you are **Known** and **Grown**

## 1. Types of Groups

**Short-Term Groups** - Short-Term Groups are like Community Groups, but they meet weekly for a shorter period of time, to explore one topic for 8-10 weeks. Some meet at the church and some in homes. These are a great way to jump into group life. Some great groups we continually offer are:

- **Starting Point** - This is an 8-week group conversation about faith. Whether you're new to faith, curious about God, or coming back to church after some time away, it's a place where your opinions and beliefs are valued. No question is off limits.
- **Financial Peace University** - This 9-week course uses biblical wisdom and common sense to help you tackle budgeting, pay

off debt, and make your money work for you! FPU includes your member workbook and a year of free online resources through Financial Peace Membership.

- **Follow Me** - This 10-week video teaching with discussion is designed to give everyone an encouraging space to talk about who God is and what having a relationship with Jesus means for your life. This group is a safe place to ask the tough questions that may have challenged your faith.

**Community Groups** - In a Community Group, a group of adults meet regularly throughout the school year to connect relationally and grow spiritually. You'll be encouraged and challenged to live out the truths of the Bible as you encourage others to do the same. Community groups get to select their own studies or go through our weekly message discussion guides.

## 2. What can I expect in a group?

- A place to **Connect**
- A place to **Study** Scripture
- A place to **Apply** Scripture
- A place to **Pray**

## 3. Timing of Groups

Although you can hop into a group at any time, there are three seasons every year that groups flow through. Life flows in seasons, and we want to make it easy for you to be in the right group for you in each season. This is why we have new groups that start and stop three times a year in what we refer to as "seasons". In January, May, and August you will see promotion windows for new groups starting. These are the best times to find a new or open group to join.

## 4. Everyone can join a Group

Our hope is for every person at C3 to be connected in meaningful community through a group. With so many groups to choose from, we are confident there is a group that is a great fit for you. You can search groups by topic, location, day, and time in our online groups directory at [myc3church.com/groups](https://myc3church.com/groups). Once you find a few groups that interest you, contact the leaders to learn more and make plans to check them out in person.

## 5. Anyone can lead a Group

We believe leading a group is simple because we all have something to offer others. Whether it's something you are passionate about, an experience you've had that can help others, or an area in which you are looking to grow, leading a group is a great way to bring people together in meaningful community. Now that you've identified how He has gifted you, your next step is to learn how you can use those gifts for the purpose He has for you. On the following pages, you can learn about your spiritual gifts.

## **A. Administration**

The gift of administration is the divine strength or ability to organize multiple tasks and groups of people to accomplish these tasks. Luke 14:28-30; Acts 6:1-7; 1 Corinthians 12:28  
**(Discipleship Team, Care Team, Kids Check-In, Production, Creative Team)**

## **B. Apostleship**

The gift of apostleship is the divine strength or ability to pioneer new churches and ministries through planting, overseeing, and training. Acts 15:22-35; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Galatians 2:7-10; Ephesians 4:11-14  
**(Outreach, Welcome to C3 Host, Group Leadership)**

## **C. Craftsmanship**

The gift of craftsmanship is the divine strength or ability to plan, build and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple ministry applications. Exodus 30:22, 31:3-11; 2 Chronicles 34:9-13; Acts 18:2-3  
**(Campus Renovations/Work Days, Production)**

## **D. Discernment**

The gift of discernment is the divine strength or ability to spiritually identify falsehood and to distinguish between right and wrong motives and situations. Matthew 16:21-23; Acts 5:1-11, 16:16-18; 1 Corinthians 12:10; 1 John 4:1-6  
**(Welcome to C3 Host, Kids Check-In, Prayer Team, Group Leadership, Ushers)**

## **E. Evangelism**

The gift of evangelism is the divine strength or ability to help non-Christians take the necessary steps to becoming Christ followers. Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8; Ephesians 4:11-14

**(Outreach, C3 Youth, Prayer Team, Group Leadership)**

## **F. Exhortation**

The gift of exhortation is the divine strength or ability to encourage others through the written or spoken word and Biblical truth. Acts 14:22; Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 4:13; Hebrews 10:24-25

**(Greeters, Welcome to C3 Host, C3 Kids, C3 Youth, Kids Check-In, Welcome Center, Parking Team, Group Leadership, Ushers)**

## **G. Faith**

The gift of faith is the divine strength or ability to believe in God for unseen supernatural results in every arena of life. Acts 11:22-24; Romans 4:18-21; 1 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 11

**(All Teams)**

## **H. Giving**

The gift of giving is the divine strength or ability to produce wealth and to give by tithes and offerings for the purpose of advancing the Kingdom of God on earth. Mark 12:41-44; Romans 12:8; 2 Corinthians 8:1-7, 9:2-7

**(Uncharted Initiative)**

## **I. Healing**

The gift of healing is the divine strength or ability to act as an intermediary in faith, prayer, and by the laying-on of hands for the healing of physical and mental illnesses.

Acts 3:1-10, 9:32-35, 28:7-10; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28

**(Prayer Team)**

## **J. Help**

The gift of help is the divine strength or ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry. Mark 15:40-41; Acts 9:36; Romans 16:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:28

**(Discipleship Team, Campus Host, Outreach, Welcome to C3 Host, Creative Team, Welcome Center, Greeters, Ushers)**

## **K. Hospitality**

The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming environments for others in places such as your home, office, or church. Acts 16:14-15; Romans 12:13, 16:23; Hebrews 13:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9

**(Greeters, Welcome to C3 Host, C3 Youth, Kids Check-In, Welcome Center, Cafe, Parking Team, Ushers)**

## **L. Intercession**

The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or someplace believing for profound results. Hebrews 7:25; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; James 5:14-16

**(Prayer Team, Group Leadership)**

## **M. Knowledge**

The gift of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to understand and to bring clarity to situations and circumstances often accompanied by a word from God. Acts 5:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:8; Colossians 2:2-3

**(Prayer Team, Group Leadership, Ushers)**

## **N. Leadership**

The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence people at their level while directing and focusing them on the big picture, vision, or idea. Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17; Hebrews 13:17

**(Group Leadership, All Teams)**

## **O. Mercy**

The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to care for those who are hurting in any way. Matthew 9:35-36; Mark 9:41; Romans 12:8; 1 Thessalonians 5:14

**(Outreach, Care Team, Group Leadership)**

## **P. Miracles**

The gift of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way through prayer, faith, and divine direction. Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12; Romans 15:18-19; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28

**(Prayer Team)**

## **Q. Missionary**

The missionary gift is the divine strength or ability to reach others outside of your culture and nationality, while in most cases living in that culture or nation. Acts 8:4, 13:2-3, 22:21; Romans 10:15

**(Outreach)**

## **R. Music/Worship**

The gift of music/worship is the divine strength or ability to sing, dance, or play an instrument primarily for the purpose of helping others worship God.

Deuteronomy 31:22; 1 Samuel 16:16; 1 Chronicles 16:41-42; 2 Chronicles 5:12-13, 34:12; Psalm 150

**(C3 MSC)**

## **S. Pastor/Shepherd**

The gift of pastor/shepherd is the divine strength or ability to care for the personal needs of others by nurturing and mending life issues. John 10:1-18; Ephesians 4:11-14; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 1 Peter 5:1-3

**(Welcome to C3 Host, C3 Kids, C3 Youth, Group Leadership, Ushers)**

## **T. Prophecy**

The gift of prophecy is the divine strength or ability to boldly speak and bring clarity to scriptural and doctrinal truth, in some cases foretelling God's plan.

Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:1-4; 1 Thessalonians 1:5

**(Prayer Team)**

## **U. Service**

The gift of serving is the divine strength or ability to do small or great tasks in working for the overall good of the body of Christ. Acts 6:1-7; Romans 12:7; Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 1:16-18; Titus 3:14

**(All Teams)**

## **V. Teaching**

The gift of teaching is the divine strength or ability to study and learn from the Scriptures primarily to bring understanding and growth to other Christians.

Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11-14

**(Group Leadership, C3 Kids, C3 Youth)**

### **W. Tongues (and Interpretation)**

The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. The gift of tongues is often accompanied by interpretation and should be used appropriately. Acts 2:1-13; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1-14

**(Prayer Team)**

### **X. Wisdom**

The gift of wisdom is the divine strength or ability to apply the truths of Scripture in a practical way, producing a fruitful outcome and the character of Jesus Christ.

Acts 6:3,10; 1 Corinthians 2:6-13, 12:8

**(Prayer Team, Group Leadership)**

**Commitment:** Varies

# C3 YOUTH TEAM DESCRIPTIONS

## Small Group Leader

**Description:** Lead a designated age group of students into a growing relationship with Jesus, while creating an environment for community and relationship to take place.

**Commitment:** 4x per month (Wednesday nights)

## Check In Team

**Description:** Facilitate the check in process with first time guests. Connecting these first time students to our VIP process, group leaders, and other students.

**Commitment:** 1x - 2x per month (Wednesday nights)

## Cafe Team

**Description:** Creating an environment for students to build community. Responsible for any food and drink items for the night and clean up of the cafe area afterward.

**Commitment:** 1x - 2x per month (Wednesday nights)

## Security Team

**Description:** Creating a safe environment for students and leaders. Ensuring that students are where they need to be, when they need to be.

**Commitment:** 1x - 4x per month (Wednesday nights)

## Set Up & Tear Down Team

**Description:** \*Student lead\* Ensure that the Wednesday night environment is properly set up and ready for students, including games, trash cleaned, and supplies needed for the night.

**Commitment:** 1x - 4x per month (Tuesdays, 3:30pm)

# C3 MSC & PRODUCTION TEAM DESCRIPTIONS

## Media Team

**Description:** This team enhances our Worship Experience by operating our media timeline. They are responsible for all media regarding worship services.
