## From the Mind of Pastor Jeff

"Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God." (John 6:68-69)

Our congregation is defined by relationships. For several years, we have indicated that our lives are formed by Christ, to live in a relationship with God, one another, and the community. More recently, we have described these relationships as relationships that are transformative for us and those around us. So, these relationships are at the core of who we are as God's people.



In worship during the month of August, we focused on our relationship with God, as we studied John 6. In that chapter, Jesus describes who he is and how he is the source of life for all the world. Jesus is the connection to God, which brings the gifts of the kingdom of God to the earth. And that it is only through him that the world can receive this gift. That is the ultimate transformative relationship that we have as followers of Jesus. That is what is at the core of our congregational life together. Our relationship with God is foundational to who we are.

At the end of August, we concluded our summer with God's Work Our Hands weekend. This was an opportunity for us to live out our relationship with the community. We served others in a variety of ways, such as picking up litter, making cards, donating blood, or assembling school kits. These, along with the many other ways that our congregation serves the community on a regular basis, are ways that the transformation that we have received through a relationship with Jesus is transforming the city of Longview and beyond. Our relationship with the community is an essential part of who God calls us to be in the world.

As we move into the fall this year, I would like us to reflect on the other relationship that we are called to live as a congregation. That is, the relationship that we have with one another. How are you building relationships with others in our congregation?

Admittedly, this has been a challenge nearly the last two years due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Unfortunately, that reality is still among us. Yet, I believe that we still have opportunities to connect with one another and build relationships with Christian brothers and sisters. This is an essential part of who we are as the church, because of our relationship with God in Jesus Christ.

This fall, several of our usual activities in the community and in our congregation are planned to occur in a more "normal" fashion, compared to last year. I encourage your participation, not only to serve others or grow in your own faith, but in order to also connect with others. If you are not able to participate in person, know that many of our activities (particularly on Sunday morning) continue to have an on-line option. And I encourage you, if you are on-line, to engage in relationship building with others who are also on-line (i.e., share comments, greetings, etc. during worship).

Remember that in all that we do as God's people, it is relationships that define who we are. It starts with our relationship God, and flows into the relationship we have with one another and with our community. It is these relationships that transform our lives, and the lives of others around us, in Jesus' name.


