Why Should I?

Week 01

1. Why Should I Study the Bible?
 - a. We're busy people
 - b. We have a lot of other stuff going on that's important
 - c. I'm not getting graded on it
2. The Bible is God's Word
 - a. 2 Timothy 3:16 – *"All scripture is breathed out by God..."*
 - b. It's important!
 - c. It describes the story of God's work & interaction with His people to bring about redemption & the fulfillment of His kingdom.
3. To Know Him & His Will
 - a. John 1:1-18
 - i. Jesus is the *logos* (word) of God
 - b. 1 John 2:3-8 – *"We know that we have come to know him if we keep his commands."*
 - c. To know Jesus, to know God, you must know His word.
 - i. Without the word there is no salvation!
 - ii. Romans 10:13-15 – *"How can they believe without hearing about Him?"*
4. It Makes You Wise
 - a. 2 Timothy 3:15
 - b. Proverbs 1:7 – *"The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom & instruction."*
 - c. Wisdom is always associated with God & His Word
 - i. Foolishness is contrasted with wisdom, foolishness leads to death & destruction
5. It is Profitable
 - a. 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - b. Psalm 1:1-3


- c. John 13:17 – *“Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.”*
 - d. God blesses those who are obedient to Him
 - i. You cannot be obedient, unless you know His word
6. To Defend Yourself from Sin
- a. Ephesians 6:10-18
 - i. *“Belt of truth”*
 - ii. *“Sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.”*
 - b. Temptation of Jesus
 - i. Jesus knew & quoted Scripture to defend against sin & temptation
7. To Mature Yourself in Godliness
- a. Hebrews 5:12-14
 - i. There is an expectation to grow & mature in your spiritual life
 - ii. The primary way we do that is through studying God’s Word, the Bible
 - b. Romans 12:2 – *“Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind.”*



Week 02

1. The Bible is not about you!
 - a. You are not the center of everything,
 - b. God is!
 - c. Stop asking, "What does this passage mean to me?"
 - i. Instead, ask, "What is God teaching me in this passage?"
2. The Bible is about God's plan of salvation in Jesus.
 - a. Jesus From Cover to Cover
3. The Bible was originally written to different people & groups, for different reasons, by different people over about 4,000 years.
 - a. It is important that we keep the appropriate context in mind as we read & study the Bible.
 - i. Who wrote this passage?
 - ii. Why did they write it?
 - iii. Who were they writing it to?
 - iv. What issues of that day were they addressing?

Bible Study Method #2

INDUCTIVE BIBLE STUDY


- Inductive Reasoning is the process of using examples & observations to reach conclusions.
- Inductive Bible Study involves reading & observing the text, in its original context to find its original meaning, we then apply that truth to our own setting & lives.
 1. Read the Passage
 2. Determine the Context
 3. Comprehend what's happening in the passage
 4. Interpret what is happening in the passage

5. Apply it to your setting & life

 - g. What does this passage prompt me to pray to God?



 - i. What is it saying?

 - b. E – explain
 - i. Context of the passage.
 - ii. What is being communicated?

 - iv. What does it mean?
 - c. A – apply
 - i. What do these truths mean today?

How to Study the Bible

WORD/THEME STUDY

Week 05

1. Word studies allow you to look in depth at the meaning & context of important words.
2. NONE OF THE BIBLE WAS ORIGINALLY WRITTEN IN ENGLISH!!!
 - a. Written in Hebrew, Greek, with a little Aramaic sprinkled in.
 - b. The original words had to be translated into English, they often times carried more nuanced meanings than what could easily be conveyed by a word or two in English.
 - c. Often we lose a little bit of the intended meaning or context because of the necessity of translation.
 - d. Studying words allows us to look deeper at what the authors, & the Holy Spirit, were really trying to get at.
 - e. How was the word used throughout the Bible, what can that teach us about it's meaning in this particular passage?
 - f. Need to use outside resources to make sure you are getting the correct word in the original language, as well as it's definition & root word/meaning.
3. Theme Studies are similar to word studies, in that you tracing a particular theme throughout scripture so that you can have a better understanding of what the whole Bible teaches about it.
 - a. Themes might include:
 - i. Adoption, salvation, temple, judgment, redemption, love, kingdom, exile, mission, community, blessing, light, covenant, sin, mercy.
 - ii. There are many others.
