Message: "The Regeneration Antidote"

Ephesians 2:1-10

Central Thought: Regeneration means that Christ is offering us the opportunity to identify shame in our lives, rehearse a Gospel response to shame and then live out a new, though unfamiliar life of freedom in Christ as if sin had never happened.

- 1) What makes regeneration necessary?
 - Generally, death.
 - Shame Sin makes us ashamed to be who God created us to be. Genesis 3:7
 - Fear Sin creates the root of all fear.
 - Genesis 3:10

- Hiding and faking Sin causes us to hide from God, others and even ourselves.
- 2) How does regeneration happen?
 - It is all God's doing.
 v.5,8-9
 - God comes toward us lifeless, incapable of cooperating. vv.1,5
 - God breathes His Spirit into us in <u>re-</u>creation. Genesis 2:7
 - God renews everything that sin destroyed. Colossians 3:10
 - God calls sons and daughters to practice this new life. Colossians 3:1-3
- 3) What does regeneration provide?
 - A new spirit through re-creation. John 3:5
 - A new lifestyle. Ephesians 4:24
 - A new identity Christ living in me and my life hidden in Him. Colossians 1:27; 3:3
 - A new mind the mind of Christ.
 - 1 Corinthians 2:16
 - A new position of spiritual authority.
 - A new purpose a call to live out a new life. Galatians 2:20; Ephesians 4:22-24; Philippians 3:13
- 4) How do we live out this new life?
 - Repenting constantly identify the dead places.
 - Renouncing recognize the lies in the dead places.
 - Announcing replace the lies with the truth of the Gospel.
 - Practicing develop new living patterns that align with truth.
 - Imagine the truth lived out.
 - Rehearse what you imagine.
 - Gradually replace the old patterns with new ones.
