
- Dictionary definition —

 "an offering to appease (satisfy) an angry, offended party."




Romans 3:25; Hebrews 9:5 - Hilastérion, or "covering"

"Above the ark were the cherubim of the Glory, overshadowing the atonement cover."







"[Jesus] is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world."

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."




PROPITIATION THE REMOVAL OF GOD'S WRATH

"Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus..."








2) What keeps us from embracing propitiation?


- Woundedness of past blaming.
- Holding on to unforgiveness.
















- "I am hopeless" unforgiving and unforgiveable.

 Jesus' forgiveness covers everyone but me.












- It takes to the cross each circumstance of blame and accusation.

- It affirms God's sovereign purpose in all sin and failures.














