

 - dehumanizing


b. "Turn the other cheek"?

> Jesus calling us to higher law:

- Give up the right to self-worth
- Refuse to retaliate

Romans 12:19

"Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord."



The implications of being driven by the offence:

- > Our pride and/or anger take over
- > It becomes all about us
- We forsake God's control
- > We become jury and judge
- > We try to exact two eyes for an eye

- > Our Natural human instinct
- > Goes against the grain
- > We need to make ourselves vulnerable

2. WHY IS IT A HARD SAYING?


b.

- > Refusing to avenge, not a natural response
- > Requires a supernatural intervention
- > Jesus fulfills this righteousness
- > Jesus' words draw us to Kingdome values (Rom 12:21)

Matthew 11:29-30


"Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

"But seek first his kingdom and righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."




Practical ways we can respond

a. Identify the offender:

- > Put the other person first
- > Love like God loves
- > Disregard your emotions and love intentionally
- > Jesus' response in Matthew 22:36-40

Matthew 22:36-40

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: "Love your neighbour as yourself."



b. Consider the heart of the offender:

- > What could have triggered off the offence?
- Could I have contributed to it?
- > Show grace (Hebrews 4:16)

Hebrews 4:16

"Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."



c. Rely on prayer. Walk away:

- > Apologize and walk away
- > Allow the Lord to minister to your heart
- > Rely on prayer

Choose to fully surrender your personal rights to God

We are called to be peacemakers (Matthew 5:9)

❖ We should be imitators of Christ (1 Peter 2:21-23)

1 Peter 2:21-23

"To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth. When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly."
