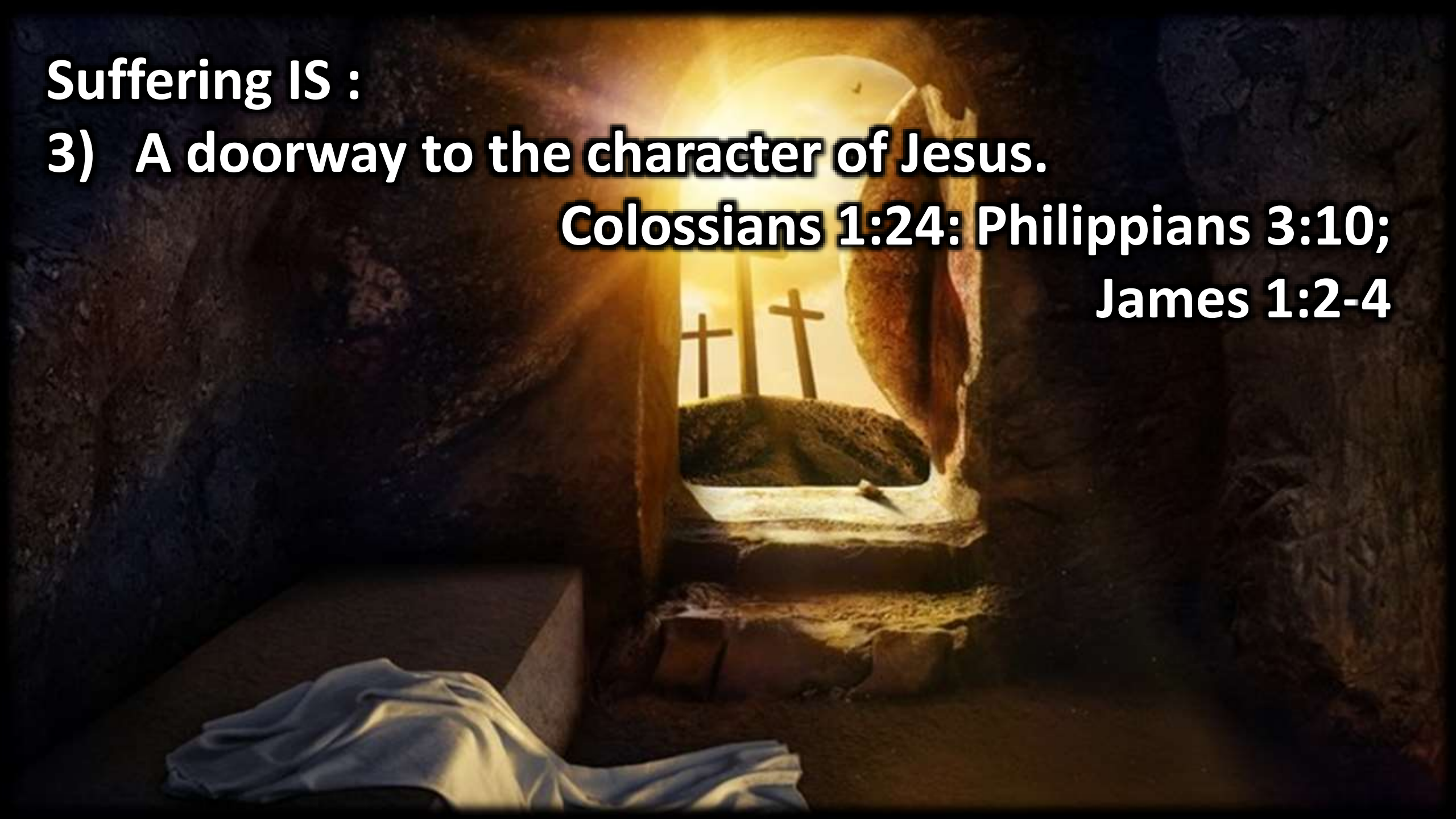

becoming like him in his death...”*



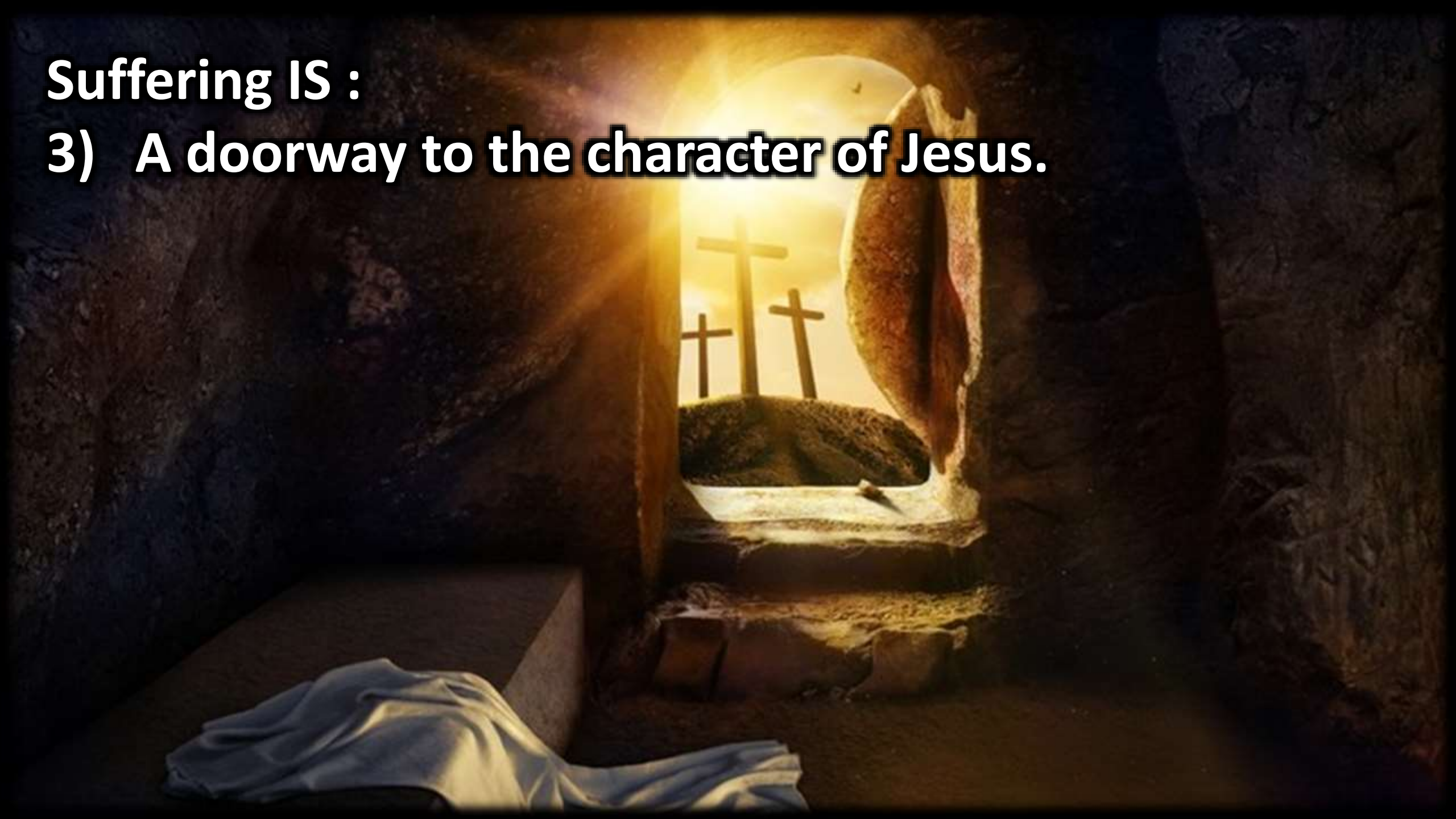

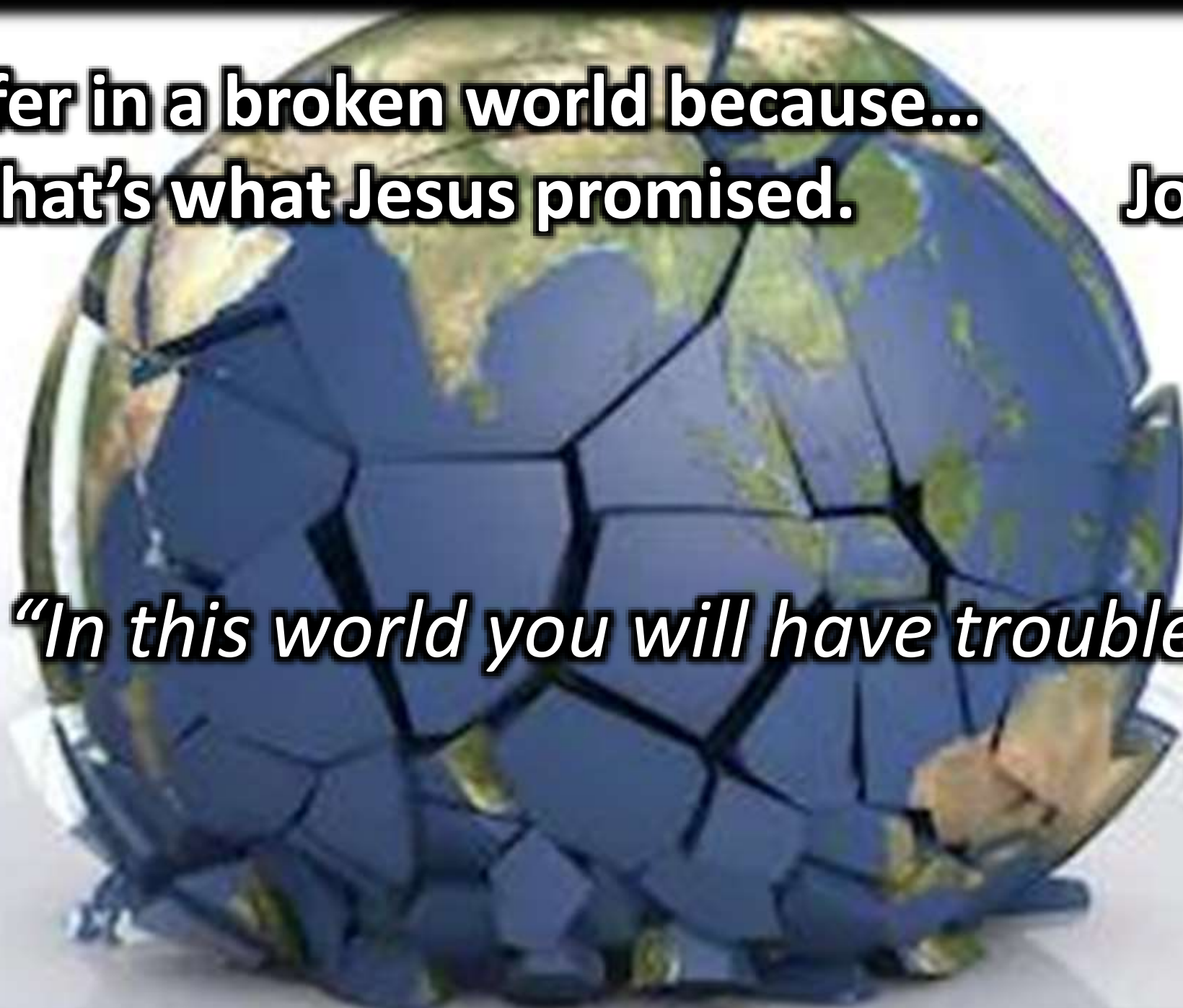

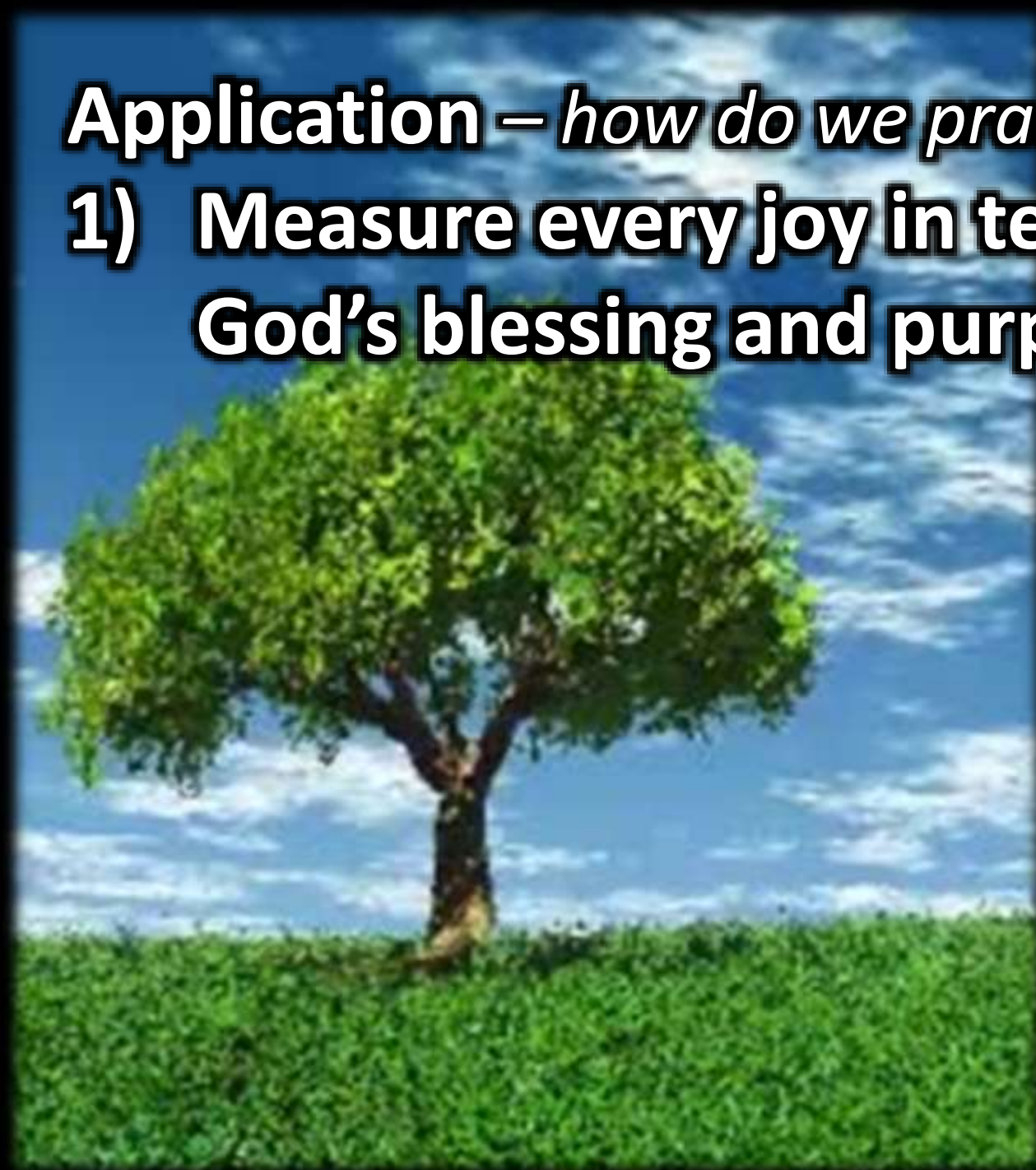

from the Father.”*

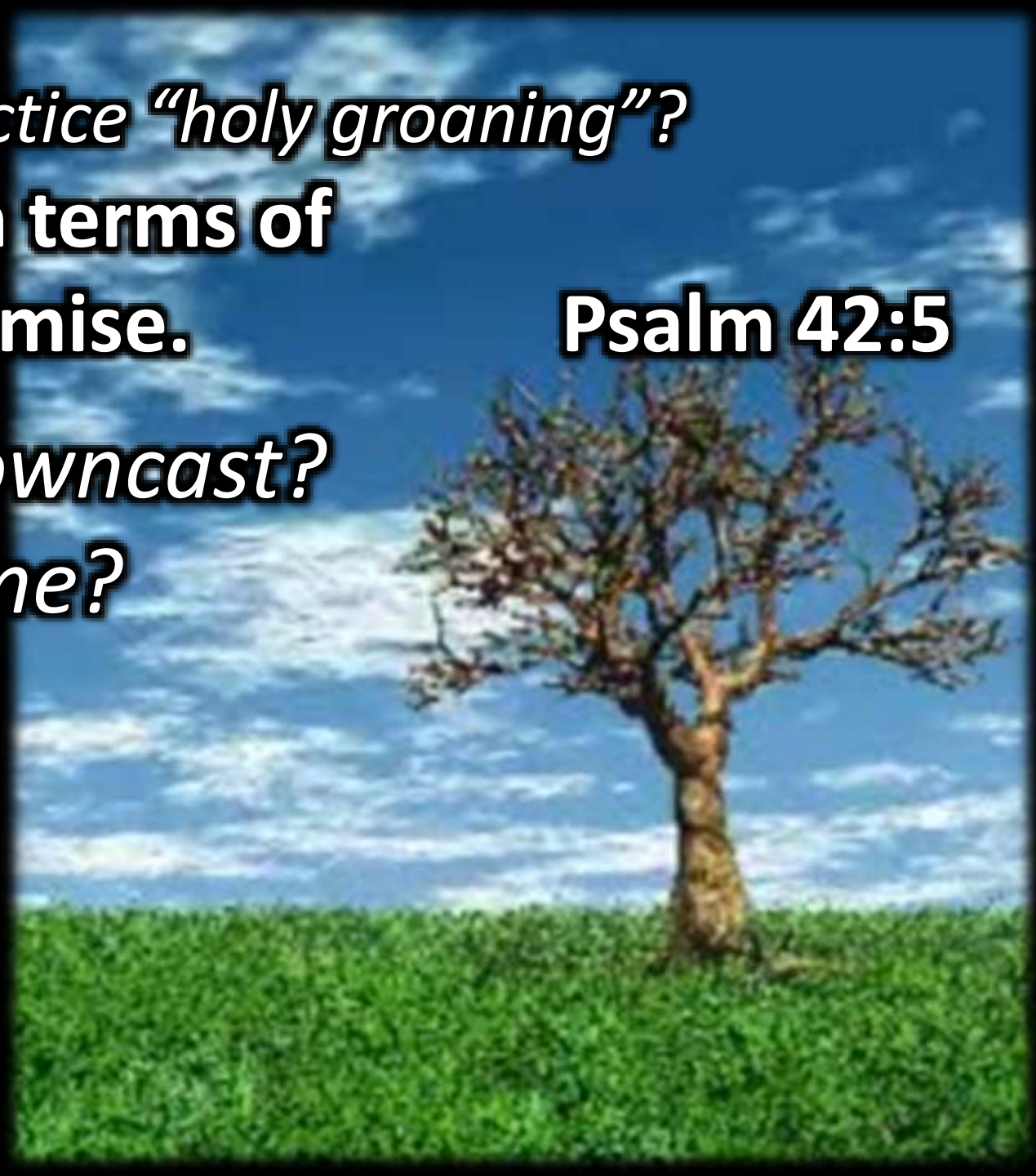

3) Define both joys and sorrows through the filter of Scripture. 1 Thessalonians 5:17-18

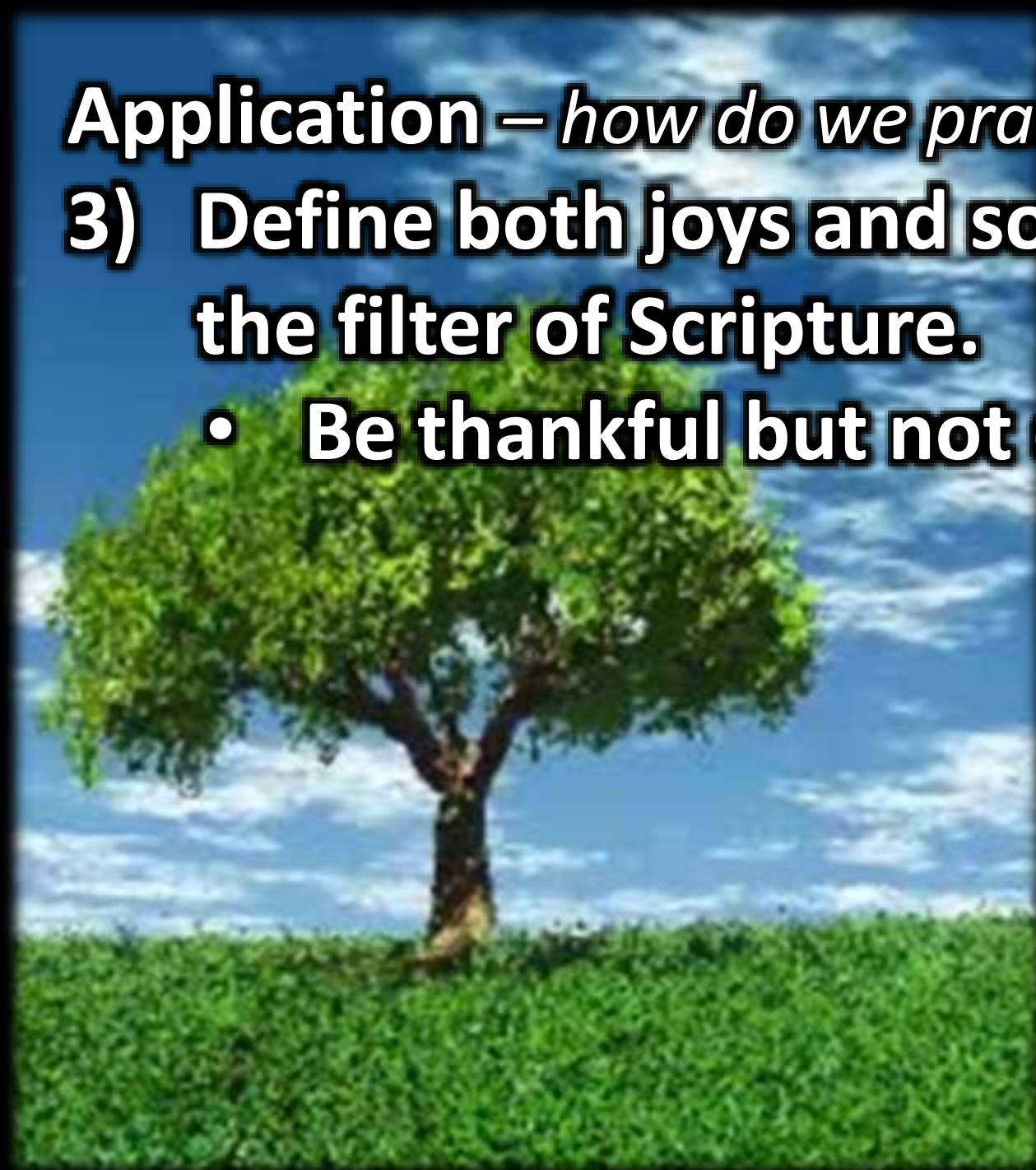
