Pastor's Page old daughter loves me, and she knows what



her daddy loves.
For my last birthday she and her mom went to a dollar store and bought me a brain teaser wooden puzzle.
This puzzle consists of 18 wooden blocks, and

they are carefully and trickily put together. It would tease your brain to take them apart and almost impossible to put them back together. Since I was so smart, I decided to set it on the bookshelf in my bedroom as a piece of decoration without opening it up.

A few weeks ago, while I was working on my sermon at home, my daddy's girl came to my room and sat on my lap. As she was looking around to find out what I was doing, she spotted that wooden puzzle she gave me. She turned around and said to me, "Daddy, open it." How could I say "No" to my little princess? So, I did. However, I did not take it apart and you know why. As she held the whole puzzle in her hands, she looked at me again and I knew from her cute eyes that she wanted to separate those blocks.

"We can take them apart. But can you put them back together?" I asked.

With no surprise, with her big, cute eyes, and a big smile on her face, she nodded.

Suddenly a crazy thought went through my mind. "Maybe my precious girl is a genius, a prodigy. I saw many of them on T.V. and maybe she is one of them. There is only one way to find out!"

So, with excitement she watched me, her genius dad, take it apart without any major struggles. Then I gave her all the loose blocks and said, "Put them back together." With a smile she started working on them and I went back to work on my sermon.

Thirty seconds later she came back to me with a sad face, "Daddy, put them back." I responded, "Well, I am not sure that I can do that either."

Can we always put all the pieces of the puzzle back together? It is much easier to take them apart than to put them back, isn't it?! And I am not just talking about brain teasers or any jigsaw puzzles but

life.

Life is like a big, gigantic piece of puzzle. Sometimes, it is like a 1,000 pieces of jigsaw puzzle that we feel so overwhelmed by it. Sometimes, it is more like a brain teaser. You might know what the final product should look like, but you do not know how to get there. Meanwhile, it continues to fall apart, and we do not know how to stop the trend.

Just like my cute 3-year-old daughter, who likes to take things apart but does not know how to put them back, we have messed up our life so badly. Just like my 3-year-old daughter, as she realizes her struggles, she goes to her father and asks for help, we, too, need to go to our Heavenly Father.

You and I need to confess to Him, "Father, I have messed up everything. Would you forgive me? Would you tell me what to do so that I will not make things worse? And, finally, would You put everything back together so they are where they should be?"

The good news is – before we have even asked, God knows what we have done and what we will do. He knows that because of sin, we live in a chaotic life. There is no way that we can get ourselves out of it. But God's Word in Ephesians 1:4 –7 comforts us, "He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. In love He predestined us for adoption to Himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace, with which He has blessed us in the Beloved. In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace." (ESV)

Yes, God the Father loves us that He sent His Son Jesus to die for us. He takes all our sin on Himself so that we can be right again with God. Today the Holy Spirit is using the Word of God to guide us and lead us every day so that we know how to be children of God. And we know when the final day comes, we will be in a new heaven and a new earth. And God will wipe away every tear from our eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there

be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away. He will make all things new. (Revelation 21:4–5)

Yes, God can, and He will put everything back together. Amen.


Greetings,

Throughout our worship services at St. Paul's, we sing praises to our Lord Savior Jesus Christ. In Paul's letter to Ephesus, he wrote: 'Speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the

Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ (5:19-20).

We often use hymns to help us connect with what we are reading in the Old Testament, Epistle, and Gospel passages. Many hymns from the Lutheran Service Book were written to emphasize teaching the evangelical faith to new Lutherans in the 1600's. The hymns we know today were written under distress of what was being preached during their time. The teaching of justification by grace through faith was received yet the concern quickly became how people used their freedom regarding the Gospel (God's riches at Christ's expense). Indulgences were a thing of the past as people learned that their faith in Christ alone (grace alone: word alone: faith alone) saved them from their sins. A movement that was quick to follow the

newly reformed church was that of Pietism. Pietism was the emphasis

We will do our best to follow public health, CDC, and lowa Department of Education guidelines when possible.

OUR RETURN-TO-LEARN PLAN FOR 2021-2022:

 To limit the number of people in the building, parents are to bring their children to the east gym door and check students into Extended Care (Extended Care starts at 7:25 AM) or drop them off at the front buzz-in door after 8:30AM. If you need to pick up your child

- early, we ask that you come to the front door, buzz in, and wait for your child to be brought to you.
- Consistent with IDPH guidance and school policies, staff or students who are ill should stay home. Parents are asked to take their child's temperature before school. If a child shows symptoms and has a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, please keep your child home. If a child shows more than one symptom and has a temperature of 100.4 or higher, he/she will be sent home. The staff will follow the same guidelines.
- Social distancing will be implemented. Groups will be limited to one or two classes.
- The lunchroom and gym will be used for serving lunch.
 The tables will be sanitized between groups. Please,
 send a water bottle <u>each day</u>, as we will try to avoid access drinking fountain use.
- The use of face coverings is recommended (not required) for all staff and students. SPLS will allow the personal use of cloth face coverings by staff and students. SPLS will provide the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE). Masks, gloves, and hand sanitizer will be available by each room.
- SPLS will teach and reinforce washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds following CDC guidance. If soap and water are not readily available, SPLS will teach and reinforce use of a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol using CDC guidance.

STUDENT GATHERINGS:

Schools may not be able to guarantee that physical distancing can be met in all school settings throughout the entire school day, or during school activities. This is similar to when children congregate in their community. It is important SPLS implement preventative health changes that can be sustainable and done with fidelity.

times; dinners with family and neighbors; picnics; quinceañeras; anniversaries; conversations over coffee-my to truly be present with them in a variety of lifemoments and

settings. All of these shared experiences foster a deep pastoral relationship; and, in the meantime, I gain insights into which parts of God's Word need to be applied to each person. I also have the chance to witness beautiful moments of growth as the Spirit continues working through His Word to form the minds, hearts, and lives of His people.

During a recent Siouxland Hispanic Ministry meeting, Carmen was our guest speaker. She spoke of her experience as a Mexican immigrant and how she first came into contact with the Lutheran Church. As she reflected on the challenges of the last two years—her breast and lung cancer, multiple rounds of chemotherapy, a mastectomy, and COVID, all while continuing to work as a single mom!—Carmen shared a conversation she had with her doctor: —"Carmen, how do you stay so strong through all of this?" — "God. God is taking care of me, Doctor. I have faith in Him and I know He's with me." —"Then why is all of this happening to you?" —"Why not? Jesus suffered so much for me. Why shouldn't I suffer, too?" We often think of healing as the only sort

of "miracle" in a situation such as Carmen's. But why? Why don't we see patient, faithful, perseverance in the face of suffering as the even greater miracle? How powerful to see the fruits of the Spirit in the lives of God's people.

Both Splash and flexibility allows me Moronga (our translators) have been working hard and have recently finished team checking portions of the book of Daniel, and Isaiah. Isaiah is not an easy book, though, and the other day it took them three hours to get through three verses. Of course, that included Isaiah 9:6-7 which

> Last week the team was doing community checking; testing the portions out in the villages to see if it communicates clearly, and getting suggestions to make the translation even better. We had hoped that we would then have our Translation Consultant come and do the final check this week, however, our translators were recently in contact with someone who tested positive for the Coronavirus. We had to cancel the consultant coming to give our translators time to isolate if need be — it is just too expensive to have our consultant come if the team can't meet to do the checking. Please pray that God makes it possible for this translation to continue moving forward.

There is a shortage of vaccinations in Botswana, so we will to travel to the States this Fall with the goal of being vaccinated. Once we are vaccinated, this will allow Tim to travel to some checking on other projects. Tim has been in training to become a translation

consultant and one of the last things he needs to do is to demonstrate his abilities of working with a different project.


