Greetings,

During the season of Epiphany, we are celebrating the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ. At this point in the Scriptures, though, we do not

fully understand what Jesus has come to do. Throughout the prophets, we hear of peace; that Jesus is the "Prince of Peace" (Is. 9:6) and "How beautiful are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace" (Is. 52:7). We fast-forward to Paul's letter to the Romans regarding how we are dead to sin and alive in Christ. "4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. 5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." (Rom. 6:4-5)

When I think of peace, I think of it being a result of the winning of a conflict or fight. Many times, a battle fights for the illusion of peace from the two parties. Both have differing views of peace and that is the kicker. Christ brought us peace and security through His death on the cross and resurrection on the third day. For the Christian, this revitalization takes place daily as we remember our Baptisms, for God "has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3). Empowered by this knowledge, let us use each day for His glory.

Thank You for the gift of Your Son Jesus, who came to live and die on the Cross so that I may live as a forgiven person who will spend life eternal with You. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.
