With the settings of my life changing, this year, Father's Day presents a fresh meaning to me.

In the past, on the third Sunday of June, even though I did not have any children, many of you would still say, "Happy Father's Day" to me. As I thanked you for it, I needed to remind myself that, as a pastor, I am called to provide spiritual guidance and leadership to God's children. Technically, I am a spiritual father to the sheep God has put under my care.

Last year, the settings of my life had some significant changes.

First, my father went to his eternal home in the early part of June. I missed my privilege of telling him "Happy Father's Day." However, we do have hope in Jesus Christ. Therefore, I cannot wait for my turn to be in heaven. And when I see him, I will tell him again how much I appreciate him.

Second, in July, Andrea and I officially adopted four beautiful children. Instantly we grew from a family of two to six. Today, a year later, we are still learning to be parents to a happy toddler, a playful boy, a beautiful tween, and a blossom "I know, I know" teenager.

It is such a crucial time of our children's lives that they are like fresh sponges ready to soak in whatever may come their ways. Our society and our sinful world are not afraid of sending their influences on them. What do we, as children of God, do to teach our children in a Godly way that when they grow up, they will be in the right path?


In Deuteronomy 6:4–9 Moses said to God's people, ^{4[4]} Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ^[5] You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. ^[6] And these words that I command you

today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."



Teaching our children is not just sending them to school or even church and letting them do the job for you. It is the parents' responsibility to take the lead to teach them and have strong positive impacts on them. To do this, I myself, as a father, need to have a close relationship with God and follow His teachings so that I can be a good example to my children.



Siouxland Hispanic Ministry

During this last year, we have had a much smaller group of Hispanic

students attend our English course at Hope Lutheran. Instead of the normal 20 to 25 students, we have had between 5 and 10 regular attendees. We're assuming this is only because of the pandemic and hoping to see a larger group in the fall. However, I have been reminded that there are benefits to smaller groups. Students get more personalized instruction from their teachers and the environment lends itself toward more vulnerability and openness. This year Jorge, Héctor, and Cindy from Honduras have been some of our most dedicated students. Jorge and Saida are married with three children. Héctor and Cindy are married with two children. They are the only Honduran families I've met in Siouxland (apparently, the same has been true for them). The strong majority of our Hispanic community comes from Mexico and Guatemala. After visiting a local Lutheran church a few weeks ago and presenting on Siouxland Hispanic Ministry, a local farming family, the Robinsons, approached me about donating ten pounds of beef (great quality cuts, I must add) to a Hispanic family in need. I immediately thought of Héctor and Cindy and since then, they have been very grateful to receive their first monthly delivery. A few days later, I helped them move into a different apartment and they've invited me to dinner on two separate occasions. It's been such a joy to get to know them, their story, and their kids. I look forward to seeing what our Lord brings through these new connections.

But we haven't seen the big TALLINK ferry ships come up the Daugava yet, and masking is still mandatory and enforced in any indoors space.

At least spring is overwhelmingly here as warmer weather, flowers, and a growing canopy of green leaves declare. April (snow) showers have delivered on May flowers.

Early Church History

May also has brought our semester at the Luther Academy to a close. Early Church History has taken us on a journey from the Day of Pentecost to the end of the western Roman Empire, the first 450 years of the church. The time of the Apostles, the Apostolic Fathers and Apologists; the persecutions; the beginning of Christian worship, art, and culture--this was part of our look at the Ancient Church (30-313); then the Empire Church (313-476) with its work of establishment and entrenchment of Christian thought and doctrine over against the early heresies. Again, it's been a journey. Twenty-five students faithfully participated. Many of them are looking to formally enroll in the fall semester which will be the official opening of the English Studies Program.
