May is the month of graduation.

Some of the young men and women from St. Paul's will finish their current stage of study and go to another school for a further education. Some will have their first jobs and start the next chapter of their lives. What an exciting moment for them! They are in the process of transition!

Transitions can be both exciting and frightening at the same time. Exciting because something new, refreshing, and challenging will be happening. Frightening because we must leave the things that we are familiar with and move on to a new setting, a setting that can either be better or worse than what we currently have.

Whether we like it or not, life is full of transitions. We grow from a baby to a toddler, a toddler to a child, and then a preteenager, a teenager, an adult, and an elderly. Not just agewise we change, we also move from school to school, city to city, job to job, a single person to a married couple, a parent to a grandparent and to a great grandparent. As long as we are alive, we are constantly in the

process of transition, and yes, transitions can be terrifying if we are not ready for them.

In the Bible we learn that out of our God told Abraham, at age 75, to leave his land and family and go to a land that He would show him. What is that? A scary transition because there are so many uncertainties. At age 99, and his wife was 90, God told How Abraham that he and Sarah would soon become parents. What is that? He cares. Y Transition, an exciting transition of trusting God's promises.

How about Moses? At age 80, God called him to lead His people out of Egypt. What is that? A mission impossible transition that Moses learned that nothing was impossible with God. And later we saw Moses and the Israelites in the wilderness for 40 years waiting for the current generation to die so that the next generation can go into the Promised Land. What is that? A painful transition that leads to repentance. What is one thing in common in all these stories? God was in their stories. Or a more correct way to describe all this is that God came into their lives and made them part of His stories. God was leading them from an ordinary life to a life-changing journey with Him.

How about us? Our life is constantly in transition. Sometimes we feel ready for them but often those

However, nothing that would happen to us is a surprise to God and He cares. You and I do not just exist in this world but are created to be part of His bigger and greater master story. We are made to have a loving relationship with Him and follow Him wherever He guides us. In Ephesians 1:4–5 we learn that God chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. He predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will.

Yes, all transitions can be terrifying. However, we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. (Romans 8:28) Therefore, let us embrace those transitions by knowing that He is with us till the very end of the age. Amen.

How are we to live as Christians? One of the questions the confirmands are to answer is: "What will I do to continue my faith journey after being confirmed?" and this question really does speak to all of us. How do you continue your faith journey after graduating high school, moving, marriage, starting a family, retiring, and so on and so forth? These transitional milestones in life, both the delightful and the tragic, are an expected cycle in the life




we live. Many times, we celebrate with family and friends or turn to comfort and consolation from those near to us as we walk through life. We lean on others to get us through hardships, but we forget about the One who cares for us the most. Our Father in heaven reminds us to trust in Him with all our heart and submit to Him (Proverbs 3:5-6). Paul wrote to Colossae reminding

the Church's shepherds to teach the congregation to "devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone (Colossians 4:2-6)."

Your faith journey is personal, but it is not designed to be isolated. The (visible) Church is the body of believers in Christ who have been called by God in their Baptism and are nurtured through the Word of God and the Lord's Supper (Eph. 4:1-6). The Church has maintained five important functions regarding its relationship between life and ministry: worship, nurture (discipleship), fellowship, witness (evangelism), and service (ministry). Each of these aspects of the Church go hand in hand with

each other. Through fellowship, we serve others by nurturing them in the Word during Bible study and when we worship alongside each other. We witness to each other when we have questions or in times of doubt. Within these five functions, the undercurrent of love and care is evident.

In other words, as President Harrison has candidly put it: "Witness, Mercy, and Life Together



illustrate how the church lives and works together to proclaim the Gospel and to provide for our brothers and sisters in Christ in our congregations, communities and throughout the world. And in all we do, Christ is at the center, leading us, sustaining us, keeping us focused on our mission. This will never change."

This is my last newsletter written to St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Sioux City, IA. I pray that you will continue your faith journey in prayer, attend worship, and be active in living out your faith. Take comfort in St. Paul's words: "I thank my God every time I remember you. Graduating from Dakota Valley Senior High on May 14. She plans to go to the University of South Dakota to study Computer Science, and play soccer for the Coyotes.



Beckendorf Ministry

In my last update I had quite a lot to share what with the translation office being broken into and the computers being stolen, Dr.

Megahan being here to do consultant checking, and our vehicles needing attention. Thankfully, in the two months since then our computers have been recovered (PRAISE THE LORD! That was a miracle!), checking of our translation work went very well with Dr. Megahan, and one of our vehicles is up and running. So, all in all, things have been going very well.

You may remember that our Translation Consultant, Dr. Megahan, had given the team the deadline of the end of March to get everything translated for the panoramic Bible -- no more translating to happen after the 31st, and whatever wasn't done by then wouldn't make it in. Well. South Korea is where the vast majority of Bibles get printed, and this is where ours is also going to be printed. However, because of the pandemic everything is backed up and Bibles are not getting printed on their original schedule. Another LBT project in Botswana is also planning on dedicating their Bible this year, and their original July date has been pushed back to November. Who knows when our August launch date could be pushed backto. Because we are anticipating having to push back our launch date Dr. Megahan extended our March 31st deadline and said the team should finish Nehemiah and 1 Kings (the stories of Elijah and Elisha), and then we will be done with translation and need to start typesetting. Well, the team has only three (3!) verses left to team check! Hopefully those three verses will be checked tomorrow and then everything will be ready for community checking. There is light at the end of the tunnel!

Next week we will be down in Maun for a meeting



with various LBT personnel (and also to have our other vehicle fixed). After that Dr. Megahan will be here with us again and will do the final consultant checking. He will be here about a week and should be kept fairly busy because there are over 400 verses to check. Hopefully that all goes very well, and the team can then get started on the podcasts, Spotify, etc. typesetting process.

we have had the head of the Bible Society of Botswana up here to meet with the Khwedam Advisory Committee for our project, and that went fairly well. We are so happy that the Advisory Committee is taking such an active - and proactive - role in getting things ready for the launch of the Khwedam Panoramic Bible, and for the continuation of the translation project afterwards.
