

Application Suggestions for Sunday, October 25, 2020

- The Application of Matthew 6:5-6 is “Keep It Secret.” This week in prayer, pursue a greater intimacy with God in your heart. Focus on Him as in the opening phrase of The Lord’s Prayer, “Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.” Consider your personal experience of the names of God, listed below.
 - Adonai—(Lord, Master)
 - El Shaddai—(Lord God Almighty)
 - El Elyon—(The Most High God)
 - El Olam—(The Everlasting God)
 - Elohim—(God)
 - Jehovah Nissi—(The Lord My Banner)
 - Jehovah-Raah—(The Lord My Shepherd)
 - Jehovah Rapha—(The Lord That Heals)
 - Jehovah Shammah—(The Lord Is There)
 - Jehovah Tsidkenu—(The Lord Our Righteousness)
 - Jehovah Mekoddishkem—(The Lord Who Sanctifies You)
 - Jehovah Jireh—(The Lord Will Provide)
 - Jehovah Shalom—(The Lord Is Peace)
 - Jehovah Sabaoth—(The Lord of Hosts)
 - Qanna—(Jealous)
 - Yahweh—(Lord, Jehovah)

- The Application of Matthew 6:7-8 is “Keep It Simple.” This week in prayer, seek to “say less” and “mean more.” Focus on listening to God speak to you as you share with Him the depth of meaning in the message of The Lord’s Prayer.
 - Praising God
 - “This, then, is how you should pray: “ ‘Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.”
 - Seeking God
 - “Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.”
 - Asking God
 - For Provision
 - “Give us today our daily bread.”
 - For Forgiveness
 - “And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.”
 - For Protection
 - “And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.”
 - Affirming God
 - “For your is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.”
