From the Pastor ...

MARK MY WORDS

"Listen to what I am saying; pay attention to what I am telling you."

Isaiah 28:23 (GNT)

Do the words that I write make a difference? I often wonder if anyone reads my message in the monthly newsletter. This is not an invitation to my pity party. I am not feeling sorry for myself. I don't know the answer to the question. I am not alone. Many of my colleagues in ministry ask the same question. Do our words make a difference? We (pastors) are not alone. Many of you ask the same question every day. Do I have a voice? Is anyone listening to me? Does anything that I say make a hoot worth of difference ... in my life ... or the life of my spouse, children, family, friends, or colleagues in the workplace?

Unfortunately, human beings are not born as good listeners. Our communication with one another is too frequently grounded in self-interest. What's in it for me? Apart from the gift of God's words, we would be doomed to life alone and eternal death. We can imagine that God is asking the question. Is anyone listening? Is anyone paying attention to Me? God speaks as a Father who cares about His children. He knows that they have been born into a broken world. God calls us in love. He knows that His words are powerful. He proclaims the difference between life and death in His only Son, our Savior Jesus.

During the month of June, I invite you to listen to the voice of Jesus. Imagine Him speaking to you and saying — "Mark my words." Jesus doesn't waste words. He speaks concisely to the point. The Holy Spirit inspired the evangelist Mark to record some of the words that Jesus spoke to His disciples. Jesus taught important things about family, the kingdom of God, faith, and freedom.

God's grace makes it possible for us to become better listeners. If we will be open to the voice of Jesus, we can expect to grow in faith and love toward Him. We can be optimistic about our fellowship in Christ. June marks the beginning of our new Small Group Ministry. We are excited about the additional opportunity to mark the words of Jesus in the company of brothers and sisters in our faith family. We begin a new season of ministry together with our Voters' Assembly and the celebration of willing servants who share the ministry of the Gospel. We acknowledge that Jesus deserves our listening attention. May God's Holy Spirit open our hearts and minds to *mark* His words.



MOST Ministries (<u>M</u>ission <u>Opportunities Short Term)</u>

Who Is MOST Ministries?

Mission Opportunities Short Term is a Christian non-profit organization that connects, trains and sends short-term mission teams throughout the world, in response to requests from missionaries and church bodies. MOST Ministries provides for the physical and spiritual needs of more than 10,000 people each year by connecting Goers, Senders and Receivers. It is a commitment to the Great Commission that has compelled MOST Ministries to go far and near for the sake of the Gospel since 1989.

What Mission Opportunities Do We Offer?

MOST Ministries provides opportunities for people to be strategically and personally involved in mission work through 'Goer' and 'Sender' activities.

A 'Goer' is someone who joins a short-term mission team. With Christ as our example, each MOST Ministries team strives to address: the physical and spiritual needs of people.

A 'Sender' is someone who contributes their time, talent or treasure to help our mission team members go out to serve. Senders: make or purchase witnessing items to share the Gospel message – make or collect eyeglasses – collect or provide other mission supplies – provide prayer support – provide financial support – volunteer in the MOST Ministries office

What Do Mission Teams Do?

Teams minister to the physical and spiritual needs of people. Projects include: Agricultural Education, Clean Water Outreach, Construction, Dental Clinics, English Camp, Eyeglass Clinics, Health Education, Medical Clinics, Music and/or Sports Camp, ministries for Women, Men and Youth and more. Programs expand every year as new requests are received from the mission field. We carefully and prayerfully consider requests and offer those which will enhance the strategic plans of the mission field and expand local pastors' and missionaries' capacity to reach their goals.

As the Task Force continues to meet weekly to work through the AoR Recommendations and how we as a church may best accomplish them, I occasionally feel a bit overwhelmed. We are discussing issues such as our spiritual health as individuals and as a congregation, staff and volunteer job descriptions, lay training, small group Bible Studies, church governance and more. Such weighty and important issues! At times I feel inadequate. I ask myself, "Can I really make a difference?" Fortunately, I'm not working alone. (Thank you, Cherie, Gary, Terry & Pastor Don!) But I still wonder: Can one person do anything to bring about meaningful and positive change?

Then, the other day, someone I didn't know very well mentioned to me that several years ago I had said something during a Sunday morning Bible Study that really affected them, and that they remember to this day! I felt surprised, complimented, and (I admit) a little satisfied with myself to have had a positive impact on someone else, and I was completely unaware! But even as I adjusted my halo so that it might sparkle a bit more in the sunlight, the Lord brought to my mind other times when I said something unkind about someone, or was angry about something else and complained to whoever would listen....and my heart sank. Suddenly, I realized that those actions probably also had a lasting effect on others – and not a good one.

The truth is, just one person can and does have powerful influence on the people around them. We each choose whether we will speak words of life to those around us, or words which wound and discourage.

Everything we say, and everything we do, reflects to others either our own sinful nature or the loving nature of our Lord Jesus Christ. He is the <u>one person</u> who changed the whole world, because He was and is obedient to His Father in Heaven, even to death on a cross, to free us from our sins and welcome us into his own family for eternity. His work continues through each and every one of us as we share His love with others - one person at a time. Talk about positive change! Just one person.
