## President's Message

### **Police to Hold Child Safety Seminar at RHCA's Tuesday, June 26, Meeting**

Master Police Officer James Nida of the Franconia Station will conduct a Child Safety Against Sexual Predators Seminar at the Tuesday, June 26, meeting of the Rose Hill Civic Association. As usual, the program will be held starting at 7pm in the community room of the John Marshall Library.

The program consists of safety training for children ages 6 to 10, parent responses to a child's concerns, police investigative techniques of sexual predator cases, and sexual offender laws and registry. Children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

If you have young kids, or are a grandparent, this is one seminar you should not miss. We had an exposure case on Rose Hill Drive 2 years ago. Fortunately, there was an arrest in the incident which was one of a series in the area. On June 13, 2007, there was an arrest in an aggravated sexual battery case in Springfield.

Those of you who attended Officer Nida's Senior Safety Seminar in February know that he provides information in an understandable manner and takes the time to answer questions. If time permits, he also will update us on overall police activity in the Rose Hill area.

#### **Traffic Issues in Rose Hill**

If you haven't yet signed our petition to slow down traffic in Rose Hill, you may do so at the June 26 meeting. After we gather enough signatures, the County and VDOT will meet with RHCA to design a program to calm traffic on our streets. So far, the County has agreed to look at Rose Hill Drive and Cottonwood Drive. A high percentage of signers on other streets will, hopefully, lead to an expanded program.

School is out so there will be kids at play all during the day and evening. Be on the lookout for our younger residents. Parents should take care to caution their kids not to play in the street. We have problems with speeders on most every street in Rose Hill, so make sure your kids look both ways when crossing and don't play in the street.

#### **Remembering Tom Violette**

Thomas P. Violette, Sr., passed away June 6 at Inova Fairfax Hospital after a series of heart attacks. He had been hospitalized after suffering a stroke several months ago. Tom and his wife, Wanda, are Rose Hill

Originals. They moved to Treetop Lane in 1955 and then relocated around the corner when the new houses were built on May Boulevard. He served the Rose Hill Civic Association in a number of roles, including a stint as president. In recent years, he represented RHCA at the monthly meetings of the Lee District Association of Civic Associations. Tom also served as a member of Fairfax County's Civil Service Commission for 20 years, making sure rules and regulations governing County employees were applied fairly and equitably. After a long career in the newspaper distribution field, he worked in the alarm system industry for several years before he and his son, Tom, Jr., founded their company, Cam-Serv, Inc., that provides security systems for homes and businesses. Tom worked up until he became ill. He worked long hours, but often found time to drop by RHCA meetings on his way home. A man of many interests, Tom published a travel guide about Interstate 95 in the 1970s. An avid photographer, he was involved in a project to photograph all of the lighthouses on the east coast. Tom Violette, Sr., personified the unique character of the people who were the first residents and helped make Rose Hill the special community it is. We all are in their debt. RHCA will miss Tom, but we will try to live up his high ideals and love for this community. His wise counsel will not be forgotten.

### **New School Proposal**

The Howard Gardner School, a small independent, non-profit high school with a maximum enrollment of 48 students, is proposing to locate on 1.3627 acres at 4913 Franconia Road. The property is bounded by Rose Hill Baptist church on the east and properties on Leewood Drive on the west. The property is zone R-3, the same as Rose Hill. A private school of education is a special exception use within the R-3 district. Hours of operation are proposed to be 9am to 4pm, Monday through Friday. Parent meetings will take place in the evenings. In addition to the 48 students, there will be six teachers and two administrative staff. According to the application, the old farmhouse on the property will be preserved and restored and the new building will resemble a barn. Temporary classrooms will be used during construction. The proposed new structure will be two stories with a walkout basement. The building will be 'round' designed to harmonize with the environment and maximize usable space while minimize its footprint. The height of the building will be 29 feet (35 feet is the max in R-3). The proposed new structure will be an energy-efficient 'green' building, using environmentally friendly design and materials. Twenty-four parking places are provided with an arrangement in place with the neighboring church to handle parking during graduation and other special events. A 25-foot buffer is provided on the applicant's property between the proposed facility and the properties on Leewood Drive to the west. The application describes the school as offering college preparatory programs serving creative, diverse learners. It currently operates in an office building with 38 students and a waiting list. While the school is not a special education school, it does enroll students with Learning Differences. ### **Other Developments**

The owners of property on Highland Drive bordering Maryview Street, Telegraph Road, and Cottonwood Drive apparently plan to continue their efforts to develop. The engineer designing the commercial property on Highland Drive has asked for a meeting with RHCA to discuss our concerns which involve marine clay, buffers, lighting, etc. Previous plans asked for a waiver on the required buffer. In the case of the undeveloped two-acre parcel on Telegraph between Rose Hill Drive and the first houses south of that on Telegraph, the engineer now is proposing one

house rather than the five previously submitted. The property is laced with marine clay and an open storm water drainage ditch that is severely eroding properties on Cottonwood Drive and Rose Hill Drive. RHCA is working directly with the homeowners affected by both cases and will continue to do so over the summer. Both are by-right developments. However, RHCA insists that all requirements be met and no waivers be allowed.

## FCPS Reminds Parents of Virginia Immunization Requirement for Tdap Vaccine

Prior to reporting to school, every student entering the sixth grade in Virginia during the 2007-08 school year is required to receive a booster dose of the tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine—if at least five years have passed since the last dose of tetanus toxoid-containing vaccine (DTP, DTaP, DT, or Td) was administered. Students cannot begin school in the fall without documentation of having had the Tdap booster or having had a tetanus-containing vaccine within the past five years.

Students who are 11 years old should get the Tdap immunization and documentation should be provided to the school as soon as possible. If the student is still 10 years old, check with the physician to see if Boostrix is being used. If not, the child must wait until his or her 11th birthday to receive the immunization. In this case, and if the 11th birthday is after the first day of school, the child must have a written medical exemption from the doctor stating when he or she will receive the Tdap vaccine. The Tdap booster vaccine can be obtained from a pediatrician's office or from the Fairfax County Health Department. Fairfax County Health Department clinics will administer the vaccine at no charge Mon. and Wed. from 8am to 3:30pm, on Tues. from 10am to 6pm, and on Fri. from 7:30am to noon at the following locations:

A student receiving the vaccine at a Fairfax County health clinic must be accompanied by an adult and should bring his or her current immunization record to the clinic at that time.

Although Fairfax County does not address ground water problems, they did present a plan to improve surface water drainage. The plan included a barrier wall on one property as well as an additional storm drain between two other properties.

It is encouraging to see that the persistence of Rose Hill homeowners via letters and petitions can result in Fairfax County action. Of course, this action was aided by the help of RHCA president, Carl Sell, who acted as liaison between the parties.

Of special note: the County confirmed the rejection of the Ellison Estates development proposal. News of this proposal rejection is a relief to Thornwood Drive residents (and others) in that the Ellison development would have impacted the already overburdened storm water discharge system. Our protests have been heard!
