Dinner, Supervisor McKay Set For June 28th RHCA Meeting

President's Message

The Rose Hill Civic Association will hold a community dinner beginning at 6 p.m., hear remarks by Supervisor Jeff McKay at 7 p.m. and then discuss the Rose Hill Reserve development at approximately 7:45 p.m. at its June 28th meeting to be held in the front yard of the Nichols residence at 6416 Rose Hill Drive. RHCA will provide a main dish, drinks and all paper products for dinner. Bring a side dish or dessert to share. If you live nearby, it might be a good idea to walk and bring a chair. The Nichols have plenty of chairs, but we are expecting a big crowd. Park across the street on Hayfield Place or Bee Street and be careful crossing Rose Hill Drive. After Supervisor McKay's comments, there will be time for questions. The supervisor and his office keep in close touch with RHCA and have been helpful in our efforts to control development and those who don't keep up or overcrowd their properties. He also has been supportive of our police and fire protectors. As a token of our appreciation, RHCA has invited Supervisor McKay's staff members and their families to join with us at dinner.

Rose Hill Reserve Update

The continuing parade of trucks on Rose Hill Drive and our internal streets has tried the patience of many in Rose Hill. The trucks apparently are necessary because of the need to remove marine clay and replace it with clean fill and the rebuilding of the storm water management pond. To coin a phrase, the marine clay issue is deeper than the developer and the county thought. At this point, I'll try to stifle the urge to say "We Told You So!" Anyway, the actions by the developer in ignoring our concerns of late leads me to be concerned about disclosure of marine clay to prospective homeowners and protection of the open space between the new community and Rose Hill. Under conditions approved by the Board of Supervisors, the developer is obligated to inform prospective homeowners that the units are built on marine clay and the open space must remain undisturbed. Go to myrosehill.com, click on Rose Hill Reserve and read conditions numbers 9, 20, 23, 25 and 26. I plan to ask the membership for authorization to establish an information kiosk at the Wayside Drive entrance in order to inform those who inquire. The kiosk would operate for limited hours on Saturdays and Sundays. I also will be asking for volunteers to man the kiosk. There will be written material, including copies of the aforementioned conditions, available. If the location is not active, information will be available nearby. At the start of the development, the cooperation between Stanley Martin Homes and RHCA was outstanding and issues were quickly resolved. As the project grew, more problems arose and resolution became more difficult. The presence of subcontractors and independent truck drivers has made the situation more difficult. Therefore, I am concerned that Stanley Martin and its agents will not make the conditions clear to the prospective buyers. RHCA will provide the

information in an effort to protect the new and existing homeowners.

This issue will be dealt with at the June 28th meeting. I intend to bring it up AFTER the dinner at 6 p.m. and Supervisor Jeff McKay's comments at 7 p.m. It is an internal community issue that needs to be discussed among ourselves. I expect we will discuss the issue at approximately 7:45 p.m.

Rose Hill Silos Update

The County has approved the preliminary subdivision plan for the property on May Boulevard that contains the silos. The owner, Claude Wheeler, plans to build 13 single family homes on the 4.98 acres. The property currently is the site of a Kindercare facility. It was previously used as a private school and a private recreation complex. Before construction begins, Wheeler must obtain final subdivision and bonding approval. He has told the County that he understands the silos are structurally tied to the existing bath house on the site, so when the bath house is demolished, the silos may not be structurally stable. Recalling Wheeler's pledge to cooperate with RHCA in preservation efforts for the silos, we have asked the County to require justification for that assertion. In the meantime, RHCA is in the process of filing a request that the silos be included on the County's historic inventory. In the meantime, you can add your voice to the campaign to preserve the silos. Just send me an e-mail at sellcarl@aol.com indicating your support of our preservation efforts. Direct your friends from other communities to myrosehill.com so they can learn of the effort and add their voices in the effort to preserve one of the area's last monuments to Rose Hill and Franconia's agricultural past. We believe the silos are 100 years old and were part of the original farm before the current community was constructed in the 1950s. Hopefully, Rev. Wheeler will decide to preserve the silos and make everyone happy. After all, what's Silo Road without silos? And, I don't want to see the folks on May Boulevard and a portion of Apple Tree Drive subjected to the construction traffic like we have experienced for Rose Hill Reserve. There is only one way to access the Kindercare site and that involves our narrow, internal residential streets. To say nothing of the trucks and other traffic that will be turning off Rose Hill Drive right at the school.

Redistricting

If you receive this edition of The Rambler delivered to your door, you have been moved to a new Virginia Senate District. Previously, Rose Hill was included in the 39th Senate District along with a large number of other precincts in Fairfax County stretching from Telegraph Road to Route #123 in Fairfax Station. Now, we find ourselves as part of Virginia Senate District 30, which includes Fairfax County precincts between us and the Potomac River as well as the City of Alexandria. The 30th has been represented for a long while by Patsy Ticer, former Alexandria City Vice Mayor and Councilwoman, who is retiring. As of this writing, there are three Democrats (Adam Ebbin, Libby Garvey and Rob Krupicka and one Republican (Tim McGhee) seeking to succeed Ticer. As a result, the Democrats will hold a primary on August 23 to choose one candidate. You can learn about the Democratic candidates on line at ebbinforvirginia.com, libbyforsenate.com or krupicka.com. Since he is the only candidate to file, McGhee will be the Republican nominee. His info is at timmcgee.us. All of the candidates are from the City of Alexandria.

The Story Behind the Crape Myrtles:

As you drive toward the intersection of Rosehill and Telegraph Roads, you may notice a row of fifteen-foot tall crape myrtles growing in the median. Recently, Rick Ballard had this to say about them:

"During the summer of 2007, I stopped by the Van Dorn office of VDOT to find out guidance for planting shrubs or trees in the median between the sidewalk and the street. I spoke with Jim Betts, who was then the manager of this office. He reminded me that the storm drain runs underground between the sidewalk and curb, and that for that reason no large species such as oaks, maples, elms, etc. should be planted there. He also advised me that if any shrubs obstruct line of vision at corners, crosswalks, etc., that the state would cut them down. For these two reasons he recommended crape myrtles, which only put roots down about four to five feet deep even when fully mature, and he asked that they be maintained as tall leggy clumps rather than unpruned, where low vegetation would block visibility through them. Being familiar with the use of crape myrtles in Charlottesville, Williamsburg, Norfolk, etc., I decided to plant one of the most popular varieties, Natchez, which can easily be trained to have six to twelve trunks.

"I purchased and planted six of these in the summer of 2007, in one-gallon containers, for about ten dollars each. I watered them for the first two years to get them established, but haven't watered them since. In year three, I began to train them by stripping out the lower branches and reducing the trunk count to the desired number. To encourage production of flower heads, I topped off the top two feet last fall. The result is that these shrubs have become well-shaped, but they do not obscure visibility down the road. The only care they require is the stripping out, by hand, of the little branches that try to grow down low.

"I like the idea of others purchasing similar shrubs and lining the medians in our housing area like they do in the Tidewater region...it would show a unifying presence, give our neighborhood some continuity, show some pride and esprit. It is very inexpensive to do, and very low maintenance to keep up. Last weekend, a neighbor planted a similar row of Natchez crape myrtles, and in no time at all they will add to the continuity of the appearance."

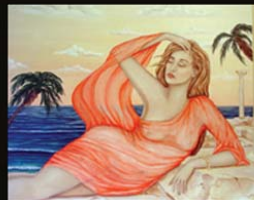
