President's Message

New Family Recreation Area Coming to Lee District Park

You may have noticed the construction activity just inside Lee District Park at the Rose Hill Drive/ Telegraph Road entrance (the only way for vehicles to access Lee District Park, I keep reminding the Park Authority). A new Family Recreation Center is being built with major components to be available next Memorial Day.

When completed, the Family Recreation Center will include a Tree House with gently sloping ramps that are wheelchair accessible, a Spray Park, a Playground for all children including those with disabilities, an old-fashioned carousel (long a Lee District attraction) and a picnic area with covered shelters, restrooms and changing rooms.

Construction of the Tree House, parking and restrooms are underway. Those facilities, along with the Spray Park, are schedule to open Memorial Day 2011. Funding for the Spray Park is being provided by the Joey Pizanno Memorial Fund in memory of the six-year-old developmentally delayed child from Vienna in Fairfax County who lost his life in a drowning accident.

Funding for the Family Recreation Center is being provided by the Park Foundation, Inc., a 5013c

RHCA makes contributions to several worthy area charities, such as Koinina (which serves the less fortunate in our area), the Edison all-night graduation party and the annual Christmas Eve dinner for our police who have to work that night. We ask for special contributions to support the landscaping we contract to keep our entrance feature at Rose Hill Drive and Franconia Road looking nice. Season flowers are planted four times a year and the bed is mulched. Budget Update

As things stand now, the County revenue forecast for the fiscal year that begins next July 1 (FY2012), will be slightly improved. Much of that is due to a slight uptick in the value of residential real estate. However, commercial real estate value has declined, so the County will continue to face a deficit. Two years ago, the deficit was \$648 and \$490 million respectively. This year's deficit will be less, but there still will be the need to hold the line on expenditures so the burden of closing the revenue gap does not fall completely on the homeowners. Revenue from residential real estate taxes is the County's main source of income. The first clue as to the County's financial situation will come next spring with the annual assessment of real estate. Expect a slight increase in the value of your home (good news) and an increase in your tax bill (bad news) unless the tax rate reflects a balance with this year. Expect to read about pressure from single-interest groups to reclaim some of the cuts experienced in recent years. For my part as a member of Supervisor McKay's budget advisory group, I will be looking for ways to hold the line on taxes while shifting priorities that will result in more police protection for our community. Public safety is my first priority. Without it, our home values will plummet. We need more officers on patrol. I think we

have cut the County side of the budget responsibly in recent years. The same hasn't been true for schools. I believe there are opportunities for savings in the school budget that can be transferred to pay increases for the classroom teachers and other essential county employees. Your input is important. We have the rare opportunity to participate in the budget process effectively. My goal is to protect the taxpayer while at the same time providing essential services within a reasonable budget. If you have specific questions about the budget, let me know and I will try to get the facts, not just answers.

Rose Hill Reserve Update

As of this writing, the situation concerning the slides on the hillside above the storm water management pond near Split Rock Road and Haystack Road remains unresolved. In fact, it appears there is evidence that a new slide is materializing. The area of the actual slides is on a construction easement on private property. The County is evaluating a proposal from the developer to regrade the area. RHCA is concerned that the situation is more widespread than visibly apparent and has asked the County and the developer to do additional tests to ascertain slope stability. There are more than 250 caissons being put in the ground around the site, except in the area of the slide. Some are as much as 90 feet deep in an effort make sure the soil is stabilized. Additional test borings are needed to make sure the hillside below May Boulevard is secure. A combination of caissons and retaining walls were deemed necessary around most of the rest of the site. The same appears necessary in the area of the slide.

On another subject, the developer has agreed to the planting of trees in areas of the buffer where vegetation is sparse. The County Arborist has suggested specific types of trees dependent on soil conditions and the eventual growth pattern. Evergreen trees will be at least eight (8) feet tall and deciduous trees will have a caliper of at least two and one-half (2 ½) inches. The effort is designed to screen our existing homes from the new development. Hopefully, the trees will be planted soon. The new plantings will be the responsibility of the developer and his landscape company, who must replace any trees that die during the warranty period. After the community is built out, responsibility will shift to the new Homeowners Association.

Unlike Rose Hill proper, the new community

will be governed by the HOA. Each property will have equal membership and MUST pay dues for operation of the group and such services as trash removal, landscaping and maintenance of open space, etc. The HOA also no doubt will include architectural rules governing decks and other additions as well as paint colors, etc. Just like Rose Hill, the new owners also will be subject to County laws concerning blight, multiple occupancy, unregistered vehicles and the overall upkeep of property, to name a few. The difference is that the HOA can levy fines in addition those administered by the County.

Update, information

Captain Shawn Bennett and Master Police Officer James Reid of the Franconia Police Station addressed a large crowd at the October RHCA meeting. Captain Bennett announced that there had been an arrest in the murder of 18-year-old Wyatt Campbell on October 14. The murder occurred behind the Rose Hill Shopping Center. A 15-year-old Rose Hill area boy was arrested on October 22, the day of the RHCA meeting. Captain Bennett said the murder was a random act and that Rose Hill remains a safe place to work, play and live. MPO Reid followed up by assuring everyone that the event was not gang related. He answered questions for more than an hour, reassuring everyone there was no reason to be afraid in Rose Hill. He and Captain Bennett both received applause when they finished their remarks. Also present was Shelia Campbell, the mother of the deceased, who thanked the police, neighbors and community for their support, condolences and prayers. Residents were reminded by MPO Reid of the importance of the Neighborhood Watch and offered to make himself available for training if necessary. Woody Betts, chairman of our Neighborhood Watch, and the president indicated their interest in setting up


a session. In Rose Hill, the Neighborhood Watch is an ongoing operation with various residents on the watch 24/7. Anyone can be a Watcher! Contact Woody or Carl to volunteer.
