

Hello again fellow Grace members. Summer is in full swing, the garden will be producing soon, and worship numbers are increasing. I had the pleasure of meeting with our synod representative again in early June. What she has found is that none of the pastors in our area are currently interested in starting to be the pastor at both Grace and their home church. They are focused on getting their church back open and building up the sense of community and togetherness that has been lost for the past year plus. This is understandable and a bit of a roadblock in our immediate search, however, none of the pastors were a permanent "no". All have remained open to the idea in the future once they get back to "normal" and can discuss it with their congregation's leadership.

They synod had a couple of ideas (one brought by a local pastor) to get us an interim pastor. This person would act as our part-time pastor while we continue our search for a permanent, part-time pastor. So she is working to flush out the ideas and then present us with the options that are feasible. In the meantime, pulpit supply is almost fully booked through the end of August, including some new faces (yes, I'm still somehow finding new pastors to come preach even though it seems like we've seen every new face available) to go along with some familiar faces.

I want to take this opportunity to commend the Call Committee for all they are doing. They have almost completed our Ministry Site Profile that helps future candidates, other synods, and the ELCA as a whole see what Grace is all about as we continue or pastoral search. This was no easy task, took a lot of research, and a lot of time to put together. The next steps will be the call committee meeting with the synod to get an understanding of how the call process will move forward in the coming months as our search continues to the next steps. While they have done a lot of work already, that doesn't mean you still can't volunteer to be a part of the team as they journey to the next steps of the process. If you are interested, please let me know and we'll get you connected to the team.

I'm hopeful that we get a more steady pastoral presence to give us a more solid footing to stand on as we open our doors to the community again as well as open our hearts and minds to the process of finding our next pastor.



We welcome people to come use the walking path in the back of the church. There is a little, basic map of just the path itself tacked to the pavilion.



(Sometimes, we can lose track.) (smile) Generally, it can take 20 minutes to walk one mile, but it is all relative. It is approximate that it takes 7 or 8 laps to go one mile.

Jack grew up in Elburn and graduated from the Elburn High School (currently the Elburn Community Center). He lived with his Grandmother, Elizabeth Crystal, as his parents were both blind. His parents had met at the Jacksonville School for the Blind, graduated from there, and later worked in Chicago. Living in Elburn with "Grandma Lizzie" was a safer and more wholesome environment for a young boy. Eventually his parents also moved to Elburn. Jack began work at School District #129 (West Aurora) in 1954 and retired from there in 1954 and retired from there in completing 38 years of service. Retirement was brief as Jack worked at Kane County Bank and later, as Grace church sexton. Woodworking, a hobby, and a gift, provided many outlets, including remodeling and furniture construction. Examples of his work can be found at church: candle stand,

wreath stand, movable cabinets.

Jan grew up on a farm in north central Illinois and graduated from Wenona, IL High School. She was active in her church, 4 H, and in music. She attended Augustana College in Rock Island, IL and graduated in 1960 with a degree in elementary education. She began teaching first grade at the newly constructed Hall School on the west side of Aurora, IL after graduation. She taught there for five years and that is where she met Jack, who was head of maintenance at Hall School. It was a great experience there and they have maintained close friendships with several of the Hall staff to this day. When she left Hall School to start a family, she was able to use her music by giving piano lessons in her home. (Some of our church youth took lessons.) Eventually, Jan went back to work, starting at the Mid Valley Area Vocational Center (Kaneland). However, a change of career took place when she began working at Kane County Bank in Elburn. She became a Trust Officer and retired from there in 1998. A part-time opportunity at Waubonsee Community College came up (Admissions Office) which proved to be very interesting, and a two-year plan turned in 12 years, retiring again in 2010.

Jack and Jan were married at Bethany Lutheran Church in Wenona on June 28, 1964. It was 104 degrees, the hottest day of the summer (no air conditioning in the church back then). They survived and will be celebrating 57 years of marriage on June 28th. They have been members at Grace Lutheran since 1964, a wonderful church home.

Jack and Jan lived in Elburn for most of their married life. They moved to Sycamore in 2003, and five years ago they moved to a duplex at Oak Crest, a retirement community in DeKalb. They have two children: Kathleen and Daniel. Kathleen is married to Kevin Callaghan, and they reside in Becker, Minnesota and have three sons. Daniel is married to Jennifer (Briesacher) and they live in Sycamore with their two daughters. It is a blended family as Jack also has two children: Teresa (Kevin) Woods who lives in Becker, MN, and David (Susan) Docherty, living in Palm Beach, Florida. As a blended family, they have 14 grandchildren and 17 greatgrandchildren.
