

What to do:

- Sanitize your hands first.
- Use this basket to collect pinecones around the church property.

Why:

How to use them:

Who:

- Dawn to dusk. After church. Morning or evening stroll.
 Mid-day break from the computer for your grown-up's

Also, in the southwest corner of the path, there is a large rock. On it has a little mesh black bag with 7 golf balls in it. It is a way to keep track of how many times you've walked around the path. (Sometimes, we can lose track.) (smile) Generally, it can take 20 minutes to walk one mile, but it is all relative. It is approximate that it takes 7 or 8 laps to go one mile.

In the merry month of May, a special lady came into the world! Margaret Marie was born on May 5, 1931 in Geneva, Illinois to Irene Abrahamson Carlson and Lester Carlson. She was baptized at Grace in 1936 and reaffirmed her faith with the 1945 Confirmation Class. Margaret went to school right here in Lily Lake through 8th grade and graduated from St. Charles High School in 1949. On April 25, 1953 Margaret married Wally Swanson at Grace. They had three boys, Jeff, John, Tom and one daughter, Joan Marie. Joan Marie was born on August 18, 1956 but

passed away on February 28, 1957. While in high school Margaret started working for DuKane until 1955 when she and Wally bought the family business, Abrahamson Plumbing and Heating. Margaret sold the business to her son, Jeff. The family business operated from 1902 to 2018.

Margaret has been a member of Grace for 85 years! Her great grandfather, Carl Jacob Abrahamson, served on the first church board. Serving the church got into Margaret's blood through her family. Just read on to learn how she has served Grace in the past and present.

Margaret taught Sunday School for many years, helped with Vacation Bible School, and sang in the Choir. She belonged to Luther League, a youth group for teens. She has helped with the Altar Guild and at the church garage sales as well as serving funeral luncheons. Margaret belonged to the Quilters' Group that made quilts for Lutheran World Relief. She played dominoes with people that met at Grace for lunch and fellowship. Traveling with the Grace Roadrunners around the United States gave her many fond memories. Margaret has not shied away from being on church committees. She helped organize both the 100th and 125th Anniversary celebrations at Grace.

Margaret continues to stay active in the Rebecca Circle (previously known as the Grace Gems) and has served as president of this group. She makes prayer shawls, baptismal blankets, scarves for children at Christmas time and items for VBS. She also helps get church mailings out.
