From The Pastor

o you realize how key September is for families? School has begun, schedules are filling, and every family chooses and establishes its priorities. With numerous options, families clearly identify to God and others what their family will, shall we say, worship. Sundays come into play in these scheduling decisions. Do we go to church . . . or to a higher priority event? After all, church meets 52 times a year. What does it hurt to miss once or twice, or once a month, or every other week? On a Facebook page I was reminded recently of a post from 2015. "Papa" was living out his last days of a fight with cancer and unbeknownst to him his grandson took a selfie sitting by him in worship and posted it on Facebook, stating how impressed he was with his grandfather's faithful attendance at church every week. Papa's answer to the question about coming when he could barely walk or sleep, was no longer eating and was in great pain, was still to attend worship. The grandfather's response was, "If Jesus could walk to the cross for me, as long as I'm alive I can walk into church for Him." The grandson was my son, Micaiah. The man was my father-in-law, Bill McMullen. Three weeks after Bill said those words he passed from this life into the presence of Jesus. There is also a recent Facebook quote from the Christian church in Afghanistan immediately after the Taliban took control: "We will gather, and likely die." The webpage then says, "The church in America. We will gather . . . unless there is a cookout, birthday party, or if it's a nice day, or there's a chance of rain, or I'm a little tired or something." We should consider the handful of Afghani saints walking close to Jesus and lukewarm American churches these last days. I am convinced part of the problem is that we consider each Sunday whether to "go to church" rather than prioritizing every Sunday for the corporate worship of Jesus (ENCOUNTER GOD), to gather with believers for prayer/Bible study/sharing life/serving (EXPERIENCE GOD TOGETHER), and whether to love Christ and others above self (EMPTY SELF). The days grow darker and point more to Christ's coming judgment. The sermons in Ephesians have clearly proclaimed that Christians are not merely to accept the blessings of God. We are to put off this world and put on Christ as an appropriate response for those who Biblically hear and then obey our sovereign Lord with all our eternal blessings!

In worship we begin Ephesians 6 with its instructions on the call to spiritual arms in order to stand against the spiritual warfare we are in. Wednesdays we are having great fellowship time around the supper table, followed by multiple adult equip classes and a schedule for all ages. This is a special time for the whole church to be together weekly. Sue Bartlett-Kosman and our kitchen crew are providing wonderful meals, and Brett, Caleb, Mandy and church leaders are providing excellent quality discipleship for all ages.

There is definitely no higher God-ordained place to imitate and learn the love of and for God and each other than in marriage and church. I have addressed church, so let's consider a great opportunity to strengthen marriages. It is our Marriage Conference at Faith Friday night, September 24. It is so important the staff has agreed to prioritize, attend and plan the night with childcare, youth and all ages engaged. Robin and I consider it so important that we will attend during our week of vacation in order to pray, support and minister to our families.

Do you know that our church is financially supporting 8 college or newly-married couples, with 3 ministering on the church staff and 5 ministering outside the church? These are incredibly gifted and spiritual young adults and we are blessed to be able to worship with, mentor and support them as they begin their ministries. Be sure and pray for and make a point to meet Adam Turnbo (Faith/family/music intern), Madi Smith (Faith/family intern), Kyler Crook (Faith/college intern), Jaycee Bruner (WF FCA), Trent and Megan Creacy (MSU BSM), and Tyler and Cindy McMurry (MSU BSM). I am extremely grateful God has entrusted these and many more devoted disciples of Christ to us to prepare for ministry.
