### From the Desk of Rev. Bob Stauffer

Well, we come to the close of a very eventful year! So many things have happened this year, some that we rejoice in, and some that bring us sorrow. But in all of these events, we are reminded that God is with us and that no matter what our circumstances are, He is always present.

For me and my family there have been many changes this year. And one of the biggest of those changes has been my appointment as the EPC'S National Director of Church Health. What that has meant is that since August I have essentially been working three jobs (National Director, Presbytery Church Health Director, and Transitional Pastor at Bethany.)

I have been told that I have a pretty large capacity in terms of getting things done but the truth is something needs to change for both me and my family. So effective the end of this year the Session has approved my request to no longer be preaching at Bethany. Fortunately, we are supremely blessed to have four other preachers here and they will continue in doing their excellent work until the new pastor comes. I will continue to serve here with office hours, moderating the session, helping with the Outreach and Implementation Teams, and giving support to the Pastor Search Team. And I will continue those duties until the new pastor is on board.

My new position will require lots of new duties and travel (especially on weekends) and I never want to be in a position where I am preaching the Word of God unprepared. So while you will see less of me on weekends you can be assured that I will still be around to harass Steve and Lois very regularly.

Thank you for your understanding of this transition as I hope to continue to be faithful to my calling both here and across the U.S. while maintaining balance in my personal and family life. You are in extremely good hands with the pulpit staff and leadership and I can't wait to see what the Lord has in store for Bethany in the months ahead!

### Annual Congregational Meeting

Our annual congregational meeting is scheduled for January 16. This will only be a very brief meeting with the purpose of postponing the rest of the meeting until January 30. This is necessary so the Finance Committee can complete the final financial reports for 2021.

### Update from the Pastoral Search Committee

So far, we have received 11 applications.
Candidates submit their Personal Information
Form which includes basic personal information
and information where they stand on theological,
pastoral or practical topics. With it the candidates
submit cover letter, describing why they are interested in the position of Senior Pastor at Bethany
as well as links to sermons by the candidate.

Each member of the Pastoral Search Committee will then do his/her own research, looking through the Personal Information Form, listening/watching the candidate's sermon, etc. At our meetings, we discuss our impression of the candidate, exchange opinions about strengths and weaknesses, etc.

Sometimes we ask for more information from the candidate, if we need clarification on their Personal Information Form or we call references they gave us. If we are confident on the information they provided, and it aligns with our profile of the prospective candidate, we move the candidate forward in our process.

The next step is a Zoom Interview. Thanks to technology we can have this done through the internet, the Pastoral Search Committee in Carson Chapel and the candidate at his home. For this interview the Committee has prepared questions


to get to know the candidate a little bit better and give him the opportunity to ask us questions about Bethany. After the interview we brainstorm about the interview, but then give each member time to reflect on it for a week or so.

Depending how the interview goes, we will move the candidate forward to another Zoom interview. The second Zoom interview is designed to know more about the candidate's theological positions and his experience as a pastor at his current church, what his weekly schedule looks like, etc.

The next step is an in-person interview. Even though the Zoom interview provides a good opportunity it does not give us the personal, face-to-face interaction we need.

Currently, we have candidates scheduled for the in-person interview as well as candidates for the first Zoom interview.

Each step is accompanied with prayer, personally and as a committee. We ask you to keep us in your prayers throughout the whole process: individually, as a committee and during meetings. 


