In each interview with the committee, it became clear that Bethany would be our new home and Mercer is where God has called us to minister. Even our time and experiences at Grove City College have prepared us. We already know much about the broader community and are excited to be back!

Another spiritual truth that has been clear is that God gives us just a large enough glimpse of His plan to keep us on the right path, and more importantly keep us reliant upon Him. For it is God who coordinates all things together for good. It is God who will reap the glory from our obedient lives. It is God who we serve and trust. Although these realities are clear in our transition to Mercer, it is not always so clear in life. There are moments of clarity and clear vision from God. This can be seen in scripture. Look at Moses upon the burning

bush or Saul as he beholds Jesus who he was persecuting. Yet scripture shows many ambiguous moments. There are situations where God's desire is not as clear or simple. For example, should David take King Saul's life in the cave? Or should the Apostle Paul take John Mark with him on a missionary journey?

Can you think of a few moments of clarity from God? Perhaps your conversion, or career path, or a clear push to share your faith with someone? These moments of clarity come. Yet our lives are spent mostly in normal moments where God calls us to be faithful to his purpose and call upon us, but He does not always make the action step crystal clear. Although God can and does give specific direction, it is more normative that we must be faithful to the general direction He gives our lives. What direction might that be, you ask? Well, it is one you are probably well versed in: "Jesus replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments (Matthew 22:3740)." Faithfulness to God and His call on your life is as simple as obeying this command in Matthew 22, which is not really simple at all, but it is a great starting point. There are other basic calls upon our lives: make disciples, share our faith, care for the poor, etc. This great command is foundational.

As you go about your day and week, whether God is making His plans for your life clear or not, remember the call He has given you. A call to love Him. Love him in the good and wonderful moments but also in the hard, tired, and sad moments. We love because He first loved us. As we love Him, he then gives us the ability to love others. We love them because they deserve love as image bearers who are also created for a purpose. Finally, we are called to faith and reliance upon God. Anyone can obey God in the crystal clear moments. What is hard is to have faith, reliance, and obedience to God in the day-to-day life He gives us. Remember even our faith and reliance can only happen through God.


