Redeemer Community Church of Minonk

An update on the building, generosity, & timeline

My kids don't like to hear

the word "NO."

and I don't either

Pastor Andy's Letter

Dear Christ CC Family,

There are a lot of times, my kids would tell you, when they want something but I tell them "no." Mountain Dew before bed? No. Fireworks for an "experiment"? No. And sometimes, I even turn down completely reasonable requests for reasons they don't know or can't understand. No matter the situation, my kids don't like to hear the word "no."

And I don't either.

In May, we gave money in a threechurch offering (with Crosspoint Community Church in Eureka and Community Bible Fellowship in El Paso) to fund the ministry of Redeemer Community Church as well as to purchase a building in Minonk to be Redeemer's physical home. \$82,699 was collected on that Sunday, which, when added to other gifts made to Redeemer by churches and friends, gave Redeemer \$216,970 in pledged money to the work. This number would supply initial operating costs, the purchase of the building, and some of the initial renovations.

Shortly after the offering was received, a formal offer was made on the building. Negotiations were taking

place between Erik Johnson, Redeemer Lead Pastor, and the seller via realtor, but at the last minute, the seller accepted an offer from another buyer. I don't want to sugarcoat this with vague spiritual talk; I was bummed out when I heard this. Erik was too. I began second guessing how we went about it all, wondering how the "fish got off the hook." I know and believe that God is in control.

that a church is not a building, and that the church plant never was or will be contingent upon man's plans or a physical space. In order for this plant to take root, a movement of God by the Holy Spirit must occur.

It's just that it seemed like we had a really good building opportunity in a good location that could facilitate ministry well, but for

the time being, that door is closed. The Father has said "no." He might have said "no" to protect us from something we can't see or perhaps He said "no" because we didn't do something we ought to have done on our part. I'm not sure, but the answer we have at the moment is "no" on the building.

Despite the building setback, Erik has been encouraged by the response of those interested in joining the plant team. With people from the three churches, as well as some oth-

ers he's spoken to, there are about 20 people who are likely to comprise the core plant team. The group will go

through a twelve-week church plant training session beginning in July, which leads up to October when Redeemer intends to begin regular weekly worship gatherings At this point, it seems that Fieldcrest High School is a likely possibility for weekly church services, though that too could change as a hunt for a location continues.


The money collected from the offering will be funneled directly to Erik and Bree's personal account for vacations. I'm kidding—just a test to see if you were still reading. The money given for Redeemer's launch and building is in a bank ac-

count and about \$80,000 is intended for initial operating expenses. The remainder will be on hand for a future building purchase or space as options become available. Should God give Redeemer a building for \$1.00 (a shout out to First Presbyterian in Chenoa!) that money will be folded into their operations costs, ministry projects, and/or be used in other church planting ventures. In any case, the finances are subject to the oversight of the three partnering churches and we will continue to keep everyone informed as Redeemer sets to begin this fall.

Please continue to pray for Redeemer Community Church by asking God to call more people to join the church plant team, for Erik to have wisdom in the many tasks involved in planting a church, for God's provision of a meeting space, and for many hearts in Minonk who do not currently have a church home to be prepared to hear the Good News of Christ.


