INDESCRIBABLE

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles, ball

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a Bible.
- Guide kids to look up and “read” Psalm 145:3 using the tips below.

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

Everywhere You Look

Creation
Genesis 1–2:3
(supporting: Genesis 2:7, 21-22)

Finding verses with kindergartners: Guide kids to open the Bibles to the marked page. Point to the word “Psalms” at the top of the page as you say, “Psalms.” Then, guide kids to find the big number 145 on the page. Explain that this is the chapter number. Finally, guide them to look under the big 145 for the little 3; this is the verse number. Tell them to leave their finger on the verse as you read it aloud. Then, lead everyone to say the verse together.

TODAY'S BOTTOM LINE

**There's no limit to
God's creativity.**

Finding verses with 1st graders: Guide kids to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show kids what the page looks like.) When kids find the table of contents, lead them to find Psalms in the list under “Old Testament.” You can help by telling them that Psalms starts with the letters P-S. When kids find Psalms, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find Psalms. Help kids find the page. When they find Psalms, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 145. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 3 in chapter 145. Read the verse aloud. Then, lead everyone to say the verse together.

MONTHLY MEMORY VERSE

**Lord, you are great.
You are really worthy of praise.
No one can completely
understand how great you are.**
Psalm 145:3, NIV

- Ask:
 - What does this verse tell us about God? (He is great and worthy of praise.)
 - What are some other words that describe God? (powerful, amazing, kind, good, loving, awesome, big, creative, etc.)
- Guide kids to sit in a circle.
- Give one kid the ball.
- Guide that kid to say the name of a friend, roll the ball to that person, then tell them a word that describes God.
 - “Billy, God is _____.”
- Encourage a quick pace to keep interest high.
