

Before purchasing an app or anything else on your phone, you must ______ It is your responsibility to stay within the texting, calling, and data usage limits of our monthly cell phone plan. If you keep this agreement, you will gain freedom and lose restrictions in time. If you do not keep this agreement, you will be responsible for paying any fees that may result from going over your data limit.

Issues to Consider as you establish technology boundaries

Non-Negotiables - What is non-negotiable in your family? Nothing illegal, including driving & texting, nudes (if subject is under 18 it's child pornography) No bullying or abusive language No pornography, sexting online dating, or "hook-up" apps GPS always on Responding to family member's calls and texts within agreed time. No hidden accounts, sneaky apps, changing passwords Parents will check phone frequently and know about every app Parent has access to phone/ apps at any time, has passcode, all passwords and logins and can install software
