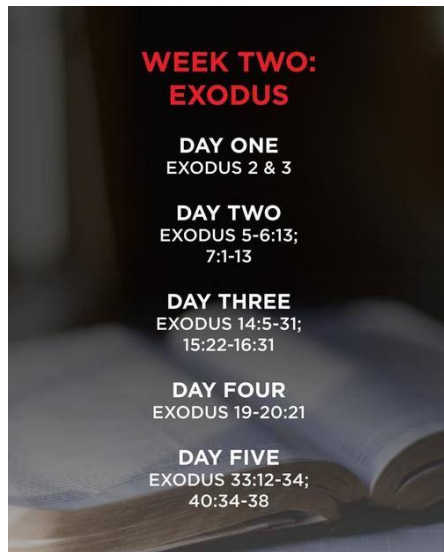
Daily Devotions



Being Set Free

Exodus continues the story after the book of Genesis and is still a part of the Pentateuch. It tells you a story about **BEING SET FREE** from oppression. Not just being set free but it tells a great story about some of God's capabilities. Let us continue our Daily Devotions in learning about what God is up to.

Before continuing the Devotion, Let us talk about what happened in Chapter 1. Exodus starts off after the death of Joseph that you have read during the first week of devotions. Since Joseph's death, there was a new king that rose up, who did not know of this Joseph. The people of Egypt agreed with the new king and fought the Israelites to take back what was theirs. But why did they do this? Well the people of Egypt thought that the Israelis were getting too big and if a war breaks out, the Israelis will join the enemy and take over Egypt. So, the king slowly started to oppress the Israelis. And the king gave an order to kill every new born son that is an Israel.

 - What is the name God told Moses to tell the people of Israel?

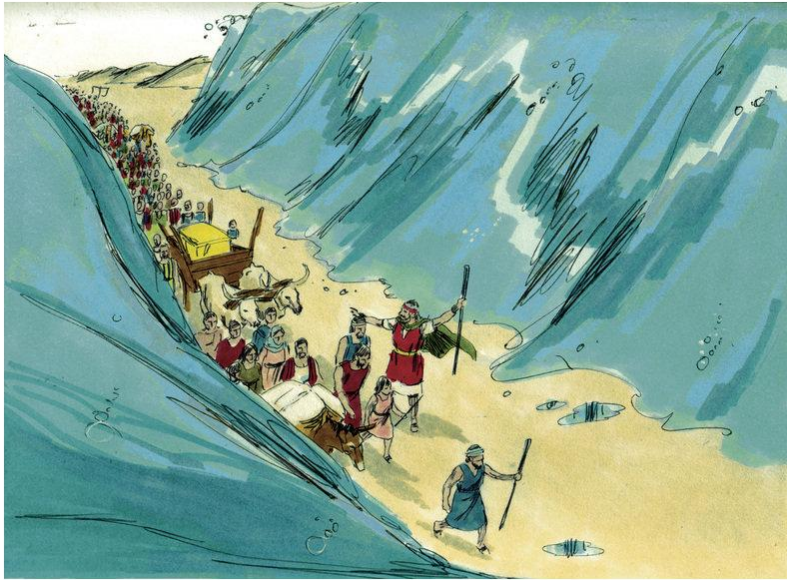
Exodus 5-6:13, 7:1-13

- What did God tell Moses to tell the slaves?

- Did Pharaoh's heart become softer or harder?

Exodus 14:5-31; 15:22-16:31



- How many chariots did Pharaoh prepare?
- When the Israelites saw the Egyptians coming, were they afraid?
 - Do they prefer to stay as slaves?
- What did lifting the staff do to the water?
- How many times did Pharaoh's heart become hardened?
- The people became afraid of God, but is it a good thing or bad thing?
- How long did they walk in the wilderness of Shur?
- What does Marah mean?
- What did the log do to the water?
- After they set out from Elim, what did Israel cry to Moses about?
- What did God do to the amount that the people have prepared?
 - What day did God multiply their food?
- How much food can each family take?
- What is happening on the seventh day?

Week Two/Day Four

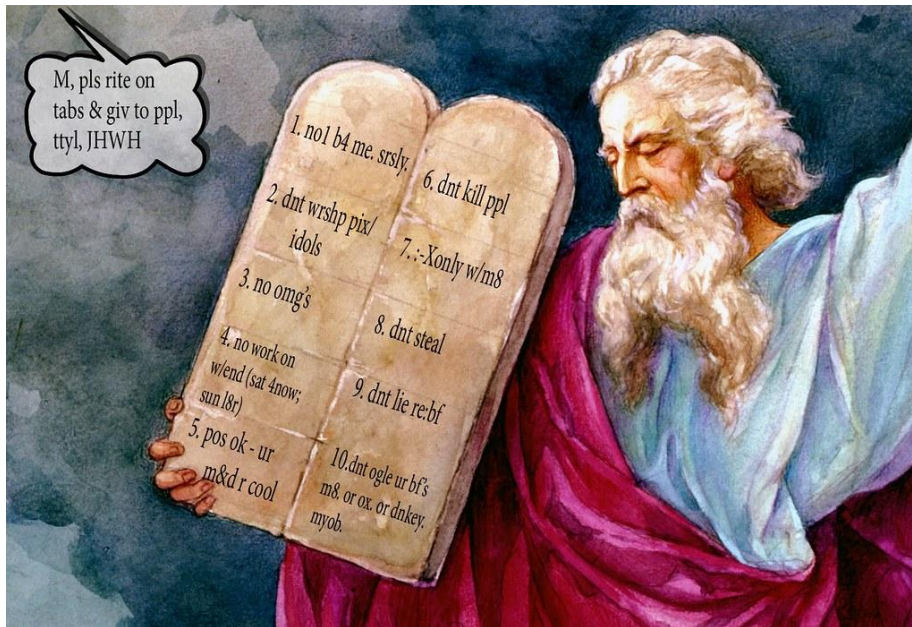
Exodus 19-20:21
