WORSHIPPING WITH OUR CHILDREN

Palm Sunday is the Sunday before Jesus was crucified. We remember this as the beginning of Christ's final, bitter walk to the cross. When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, all of the people began to praise and honor Him as their King. They believed Him to be a powerful leader who would overthrow the Roman government and make Israel a free nation again. When Jesus did not do this, the people wanted Him crucified. You and I know what kind of a King He is. He's the King who came to die for the sins of His people. Take your palm branch home and display it in a good place this week to help you remember that Jesus is our King!
