- 1. Read aloud John 17:14-19. Consider the fact that God sent Jesus into the world of his day on mission, and correspondingly as a Christian, you are sent into your world on mission. In light of these assertions from Scripture, discuss your perspectives on being sent into your world on mission.
- 2. Read aloud Philippians 2:14-15. What stands out to you in the text? What might a missional strategy be for overcoming grumbling and arguing in your world or the workplace? What has worked for you in this regard?
- 3. Following the prior question, discuss the example from the midweek reflection video about the upset airplane passenger. Can you relate to such an experience -- either as an onlooker, the person being difficult, or the person attending to the difficult situation? What did you learn?
- 4. Read aloud Colossians 3:17. What's an example of one person's quality work or character or both that has stood out to you in your life? In what ways did that make an impact on you?
- 5. Read aloud 1 Peter 3:15. Take turns in your groups giving a short response of the reason for the hope that you have. Are you prepared to talk about what your faith means to you should someone ask you tonight or tomorrow?
