## SDG DISCUSSION GUIDE

"Keeping Peace in the Church" | 23 JAN 2022

Please read Ephesians 4:1-6. Then watch the weekly video and discuss the following questions.

- 1) In what areas of culture do you currently find great division? Why do you think there is so much division in our culture today? Do you think that these divisions and disputes often enter the church?
- 2) Read Ephesians 4:1-6. Paul mentions "one" eight times in these verses. What/Who does he identify as being "one" in these verses. What is the main point that Paul is trying to make through the emphatic use of "one" in these verses?
- 3) Discuss what things can undermine unity in the church? Why does disunity happen so often in church?
- 4) Paul mentions humility, gentleness, patience and love as factors that will promote unity. Discuss how the presence of these traits lead to unity and their absence can lead to division.
- 5) Read Philippians 4:2. What problem is Paul dealing with here? Now read Philippians 2:3-5. What strategies does Paul use to help resolve the situation? How can you use these strategies when you encounter conflict or division in the church?

- 6) Read 1 Corinthians 1:10-13. What was the cause of the division in the church of Corinth? Have you witnessed this kind of division in the church in the 21st century? What was Paul's response to this quarrelling?
- 7) Why does disunity and division grieve God's heart so much?


