

## CALLED TO RENEWAL

"Who Is The Holy Spirit?" | 15 MAY 2022

We seek to cultivate Spirit-empowered restoration and transformation in our communities.

- 1. For an "ice breaking" question, from what country or countries did your ancestors immigrate? In what areas do you have family members now?
- 2. Read Ephesians 2:1-10 aloud. Reread it aloud if you have time. What are the two phases of life that Paul described in these verses? What are the characteristics of each of those phases?
- 3. At what time(s) in life have you ever realized most fully being "alive together with Christ" (vv 4-6)? What do you recall that may inform a decision or action to take in the coming days, weeks, or months?
- 4. Why do we often attempt to set up "works" as the basis of our relationship with God (vv 8-9)?
- 5. Read Philippians 3:10. Read it aloud a second time. In what ways are you practicing Resurrection this season -- participating in that same suffering and renewing joy that is God's exaltation in having raised Christ from the dead?
- 6. The UCM value of Called to Renewal is, "We seek to cultivate Spiritempowered restoration and transformation in our communities." Discuss the element "Spirit-empowered." What is your experience of the Holy Spirit, if anything? Talk about your ways in which your church or small group might come to a greater appreciation and courage that we live in and according to the Spirit (versus in the world and according to the flesh) in what He calls us to do?


