### Snapshot 2022

In September, we focused on re-engaging worship, kids and students, groups, invites, and finding a new worship space. We accomplished all five, although that last one didn't happen like we thought it would (Just look left).

Here's a snapshot of our focus this year: We will <u>create a culture of welcome, worship, and word</u> that leads to a vibrant, healthy church. We will <u>equip all in our church to have a gospel formed life and witness in Carson City</u>. And we will <u>believe and pray big things</u> for the gospel this year.

### Giving

The life of our church is in large part thanks to you and your faithfulness in giving. Last year we brought in just over 182,000 dollars, excluding a couple of large donations. Our 2021-2022 Fiscal Budget is \$195,000. We are currently on track. The budget of our church works out to these five categories:

Staff - 60%
Building Costs - 17%
Miscellaneous - 3%
Family Network - 10%
Church Planting and
Missions - 10%

Our fiscal year runs from July through June. This is a very brief snapshot, so if you have any more questions, I would love to answer any of those I can.
