

## FAMILY GAME TIME

### RETURN OF THE ORANGE

#### ITEMS NEEDED:

Two oranges, cut into their many wedges  
Plastic wrap  
A table  
A basket

#### INSTRUCTIONS:

Choose two players for this game. Set the basket between them. Give each player some plastic wrap and a completely dismantled orange. The two players will race to see who can reassemble their orange completely, wrapping it in plastic wrap after they put it back together. First person to reassemble their orange, wrap it, and set it in the basket wins.

#### VARIATION:

To add some extra excitement, set the basket for placing the finished oranges on the other side of the room from the players and the table.

God wants us to share peace with others.

### MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY:

#### Galatians 5:22-23

Go around the group in a circle and have each kid read one word of the verse until the whole verse has been read. Do it two or three times, see how fast you can go.

#### Read 1 Samuel 25:1-35

What is the third Fruit of the Spirit?

What did Nabal do to insult David?

Why was David so offended by Nabal?

How did Abigail bring peace between David and her husband?

How did Abigail bring peace?

What are some things we can do to be peacemakers?

Is there someone you need to make peace with this week?
