

FAMILY GAME TIME

WAIT FOR IT!

ITEMS NEEDED:

Two baseball caps and two baseballs

INSTRUCTIONS:

Choose two players for this game. Set the baseball caps on the floor about 5 feet away from the players. Give them each aball and tell them that when you say go, they will compete to see who can get their baseball to land in their hat first. Remind them they must wait until you say "GO!"

Give them a, "Ready.... Set...." Then pause. Keep pausing. Milk it. Let them get tense waiting. Keep reminding them to, "Wait for it... Wait for it..." Finally, when you can't stand it any longer, say, "Go!"

Ask them how frustrating it was having to wait for the game to start and if it was hard to have patience.

VARIATION:

Any quick competition like this will do in place of throwing baseballs. The idea is to make them wait for the start, giving them another illustration about patience.

WHAT'S THE POINT?

Patience comes from trusting God.

What's the longest you ever had to wait for food in a restaurant?
