<u>Church School Lesson:</u> "God Foretells Destruction" Scripture Text: Isiah 47:10-15 Key verse "That is all they are to you-these you have dealt with and labored with since childhood. All of them go on in their error: there is not one that can save you: Isaiah 47:15

Summary of the Lesson: Collapse and rebirth. Judgment and salvation. This is what you find in the Book of Isaiah and its message is global without regard to culture, heritage, or systems of government. It is Godcentered giving warning to those who turn away from God and hope for restoration of His kingdom. The Bible tells us that the world God created was perfect. We perverted that perfection. As smart as we are, with all the technology and military might we have there are so many things about the way God operates we just cannot comprehend. Isaiah was called by God to give warning to His people. The Assyrian Empire decimated Israel (northern kingdom), taking its people captive. Judah (southern kingdom), fearful of the same fate, was able to delay its capture only because they had a praying king. That delay was not long-lasting. The Assyrian Empire with its military might fell by the hand of God. Through Isaiah, God gave warning to Israel and Judah for their sins. They were chastised for their hypocrisy in how they worship God; their social, moral, and religious sins. A new power emerged, Babylon. It was a pagan state with which Judah sought to form an alliance. The warning from Isaiah proved to be true: temple destroyed, and its treasures taken; people taken captive to serve Babylon. The lesson today is about the nation of Babylon; a description of its arrogance; its knowledge and wealth; its confidence in its own might. They used their power, wealth, and fear to get whatever they wanted. They had no need for God! God used Babylon to bring judgment upon His people! Note also, that the very ones God used to bring about judgment were also judged. God's people were judged because they turned away from Him. With respect to Babylon, there is lesson for us and the world, for that matter. While God had turned over His people to Babylon, the scripture tells us they had no mercy or compassion upon the people in captivity, a cruel master. They thought God wasn't looking. They were confident and comfortable in their evil life. They sought and trusted in their own gods, sorcery, and magicians to no avail. Their empire collapsed too. While the book of Isaiah speaks to judgments against those who turn a deaf ear to God, there is hope found in the faithfulness of God's promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; that through them all nations would be blessed. Those who understand that God is faithful; is always in control; trust and believe that His promise of salvation is sure. The presence of judgment is an indication of the necessity for salvation to occur. Before we can have salvation, we must have a need for it! Despite our differences whether socioeconomic, cultural, ethnic; or religious, we are connected to each other. Those who persist in rebellion against God will receive judgment. On the other hand, we see God's faithfulness to His promise. He will preserve a small remnant of faithful believers, those who will continue into the renewed world He has prepared for His children in the end times. What do we do in the meantime? We trust and believe. The same problems Isaiah spoke of are the same problems we face today. All nations would do well to listen to Isaiah. Whether it is corporate greed, national pride, individual self-dependence, moral decay or self-exaltation, Isaiah has a message for our world today. Sin will not go unpunished. The sovereign Lord is watching. Amen.


