The word "Tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "darkness". A Tenebrae Service is a moving and emotional Good Friday service that makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles while reflecting on and remembering the "Seven Words From The Cross"

Next Candle is extinguished and lights continue to dim

Word 3

Next Candle is extinguished and lights continue to dim

Word 4

"My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:46

Next Candle is extinguished and lights continue to dim

Word 5

"I am thirsty." John 19:28

Next Candle is extinguished and lights continue to dim

Word 6

"It is finished." John 19:30

Next Candle is extinguished and lights continue to dim

Word 7

"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:46

Pastors move off of platform/Last Candle is extinguished and lights are turned off/Spotlight is turned on

The Draping and Exit of the Procession Cross Song starts playing and the acolytes drape the cross. Once the cross is draped the acolyte moves to the top of the stairs. Acolyte stays at the top of the stairs until the song starts in English again. At that point, the acolyte starts (pastors stand as cue to acolyte) exiting with the cross with the spotlight following until it leaves the sanctuary. Pastors will follow the cross.
