FALL 2021 (Aug. 15-Dec. 11)

BE-1307 Wisdom Literature: Psalms

Jared Knoll

This course is a study of the book of Psalms and deals with its various aspects of literature, including Hebrew Poetry, prophetic utterances and its dedication to the love of God's Word.

BE-1302 - Acts

Barry O'Dell

This course is an in-depth study of the book of Acts. Emphasis is given to the beginning of the church, to her growth, conversions, Paul's missionary journeys and the establishment of congregations.

BE-1305 The Pentateuch

Alan Adams

This course focuses upon the books of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers & Deuteronomy. Emphasis is given to the events ranging from the creation of the universe, the beginnings of the Israelite nation, God's protection of His people, and the Mosaic Law.

BD-1398 Eldership Development

Mark Teske

This course is designed specifically to aid elders in their job of caring for the souls under their oversight. Topics to be covered include the role of elders, growing the congregation numerically and spiritually, working with preachers, deacons, fellow elders and missionaries, communication, budgeting, and how to keep from losing members.

SPRING 2022

(Jan. 9-May 7)

BE-2311 Wisdom Literature: Proverbs

Jared Knoll

This course takes the student verse-by-verse through the book of Proverbs written, for the most part, by Solomon (1 Kgs. 4:32). Special detail is given to the different types of Hebrew Poetry that are contained within the book.

BD-2397 - Biblical Interpretation

Troy Spradlin

This course focuses on the principles of interpretation relative to the Bible. It will also give attention as to the how of Bible Study, as well as how to ascertain Bible authority. The student is taught the basics of Biblical languages and how to utilize language tools for proper Bible study.

BE-2311 Conquest, Deliverance & Monarchy

Alan Adams

This course covers the books of Joshua through 2 Samuel. The student will become familiar with the events leading up to and including the taking of the land of Canaan, the subsequent need for judges to rescue Israel from oppression, the account of Ruth & Boaz and the establishment of the Monarchy.

BE-2308 General Epistles

Guyton E. Montgomery

This course focuses on the letters that fall under the classification of "general epistles." This includes James, 1 & 2 Peter, 1, 2 & 3 John and Jude. The course deals with the practical teachings, admonishment to persecuted Christians and the admonition to the brethren regarding the Love of God.

SUMMER 2022

(May 15-Aug. 13)

BE-3320 Wisdom Literature: Job, Eccl. Song of Sol.

This course is a textual study of the book of Job and deals with the stark contrast between man's philosophies of life and the Wisdom of God, specifically concerning the subject of suffering and its causes. It also examines the books of Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon.

PP-3318 Missiology

Troy Spradlin

This course is the study of missions, missionary activity, and the missional church as related to Biblical methods and examples. Jesus came to seek & save the lost (Lk. 19:10) and then commanded His disciples to carry on that same mission (Mt. 28:19, 20). In order to fully comprehend His command, this course will use an interdisciplinary approach of studying the biblical, theological, historical, cultural, and strategic aspects of Christian missions.

BE-2311 Divided Kingdom & Restoration

Alan Adams

This course focuses on the time period of Hebrew History that includes the Divided Kingdom, the captivity of the Northern & Southern Kingdoms, the returns to Jerusalem under the leaderships of Ezra, Nehemiah and Zerubbabel. It also includes consideration to the rescue of the Jews under Ahashuerus in the Book of Esther.

BE-2308 I'm a Christian Now What?

This course is designed for new Christians to help them "walk in the newness of life" (Rm. 6:4). It helps build one's faith and gives practical lessons for "day-to-day" Christian living. It will also serve as a course to encourage experienced Christians.

EVERY SEMESTER

BD-4399 Overview of God's Plan for Me

This course serves as a prerequisite for anyone that is not already a member of the Church of Christ. However, it is an excellent class for all that would like to refresh their knowledge and renew their faith. It offers a brief survey of the Bible and shows how it "fits together." The class examines issues such as salvation, authority, baptism, the church, why God created the world and more. Students will better see and understand how God's plan was all for their benefit.
